Pastoral Letter

Christmas is coming, the goose is getting fat; wrong on two counts. Avian flu is causing much anxiety in the Christmas turkey market, and we forget at our peril that before Christmas comes Advent: Advent that wonderful season of watching and waiting. By the time you read this I hope to have attended the Advent Carol Service at Salisbury Cathedral; a truly awe-inspiring and spectacular start to the season. Following Advent Sunday we have the 4 weeks of waiting; but not just waiting in an ever-increasing panic, but waiting expectantly like Mary, the mother of Jesus, waiting for the baby to be born. I can remember being an expectant mother in December and rather than buying lots of new things, (although I did that towards the end of the pregnancy) I wanted to clean out my house, make it spotless and ready for the new baby. I remember even cleaning the skirting boards, a task I have never undertaken since. That's what we have to do in Advent. Clean out our inner selves; get rid of the cobwebs of deceit and dishonesty.

The first part of Advent is full of wonder; wonder at the night sky and at this dark season of the

year we have plenty of time to contemplate it. There is a hymn which begins "bow down you stars". What an amazing thought. There is time to gaze at the silhouettes of the skeletal trees in the moonlight, and time to listen to the forces of nature. and the winds and the storms. We seem to be getting quite a few of those, but not much cold as vet. All these things to ponder before we get swept up in the frenzy of buying that happens before Christmas and then the joy of the day itself.

Every year there seems to be a poignancy however. We have come through Covid so this year should be more sociable, but this year there seems to be so much to worry about financially. Can we afford this or that? And then there is the war in Ukraine. I have had the privilege of meeting my Ukrainian guest's parents. What a lot they have all been through, but they soldier on.

So what is Christmas all about? What is it that the baby Jesus, and the adult Jesus came to show us? The answer lies in another hymn "Love came down at Christmas, love all lovely,

love divine, love was born at Christmas, star and angel gave the sign", and there we have it. So if you have mixed feelings about the festive season, if you are anxious about being on your own or if you are sad that one special person in your life won't be there this year, just remember that little beautiful baby, who reaches out to all of us, with love in his heart for you and for me, and remember too that that love comes from his father, our Almighty creator, to you and to me. We are loved; all of us. So come to church sometime over the season. There will be joy, there will be excitement, there will be the magical light from the candles reflected in your eyes and mine and all around, and there will be love.





Marston Parish Council

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held in Marston Chapel on the 17th January 2023 at 8.00pm. The meeting will be preceded by a village meeting starting at 7.30pm. The speed limits will be discussed in the meeting and it is hoped we will have a representative from Wiltshire County Council to answer some of our questions.

The Parish Council have purchased 1,000 mixed daffodil bulbs to plant on the common. We will be planting them out on Sunday 27th November, starting at 11am. We would appreciate as much help as possible. If you are able to help, please come along armed with a trowel or spade.

We are at present in contact with Wiltshire Council and the Environment Agency and are awaiting a decision on the Semington Brook breach at Ray Bridge. A new, more substantial, bench is also being ordered for the pond seating area as the original bench broke.

Horses are unpredictable and passing horses wide and slow can prevent the death of drivers, riders and horses. The British Horse Society (BHS) have worked hard lobbying and collaborating with Cycling UK, DVSA, Living Streets and the Department of Transport securing much-needed Highway Code improvements. As of January this year the BHS's Dead Slow message to pass horses 'wide and slow' is now incorporated within the Highway Code.

Equestrians have the same right to be on the road as motorists or any other user group. Understanding, respect and consideration by all road users are required to ensure the safety for everyone. The BHS advises all equestrians and road users to familiarise themselves with the updated Highway Code and of course when riding out please always wear at least a Hi-viz tabard.

As a motorist what should I do if I see a horse on the road? If you see a horse being ridden or led on the road you should:

- Slow down to a maximum of 10 mph
- Be patient, don't sound your horn or rev your engine
- Pass the horse wide and slow (2m or at least a cars width if possible)
- Drive away slowly

The BHS collates statistics to understand the rate of incidents involving horses and riders on UK roads.

Reporting incidents helps the BHS to better understand the rate of equine related incidents and it is vital that each incident is recorded in order to make improvements. Incidents can be reported directly on the BHS website (www.bhs.org.uk) or using the BHS incident reporting app 'Horse i', allowing you to quickly and easily submit details of any incidents you encounter directly to the BHS via your mobile or tablet device.

Based on statistical evidence and with the support of Parish Councils and the agreement of Wiltshire Council, the BHS Wiltshire County Committee are funding the provision of



Worton & Marston Link

There are 42 Link (volunteer car) Schemes across Wiltshire county, who offer door-to-door or group transport for people who need help to get out, visit local facilities and access medical care service which can include collecting prescriptions. These vital, volunteerled community groups offer a lifeline for local people, including the elderly, people with limited mobility and people who live in rural areas which do not have a regular bus or train service. In 2021 Link Schemes played an important role in supporting the Covid-19 vaccine roll-out locally, by offering transport to and from vaccine appointments.

There are over 1,500 volunteers in Wiltshire and Swindon who are involved in supporting Link Schemes locally, either as volunteer drivers, coordinators or committee members. Last year volunteer drivers travelled over 750,000 miles, taking people to local hospitals, doctors appointments, shops and lunch clubs. Without the transport offered by Link Schemes, many of the people who use these services would find it hard to leave their home, leading to isolation and declining mental or physical health. The service offered by volunteer transport groups can be truly life-changing, offering peace of mind, dignity and the opportunity to lead a normal, independent life.

Demand for support for volunteer-led transport offered by Link Schemes has increased in recent years, which may in part be due to Wiltshire's ageing population. New volunteers are vital in order to ensure transport groups can continue to meet this growing demand. Prospective volunteer drivers can offer their time on a flexible basis which works around their existing commitments and mileage rate is paid to all volunteer drivers using their own vehicle. In addition to volunteer drivers, we are also looking for people to volunteer as committee members. In Worton&Marston Link we only pick up in our villages, one of the other schemes will service other towns and villages in the County. If you are interested in volunteering please email

We also opened the Hall for coffee, tea and cake following the commemorations around the war memorial on Armistice day. Worton Parish Council

For the first time in years (possibly just the second time ever), I had to give my apologies for missing the November Parish Council meeting.

I was otherwise engaged in a very important family matter that arose suddenly during the day (the birth of our first grandchild) and I wasn't in Worton - our support was needed elsewhere.

So I've decided to pay tribute to my colleagues for the fantastic job they did covering for me, that has seen significant progress being made in relation to some important issues which I will refer to in due course.

In fact, I want to heighten just what a great job they have been doing under tricky circumstances, not just now, but over the years that I have had the privilege of being Chairman.

We currently have no clerk -indeed we have been without one for several months. In practical terms, this means that we have no one to oversee the nuts and bolts of serving a Parish effectively, sensibly, and, importantly, legally. The clerk does far more than accurately minuting meetings, as they keep us on the straight and narrow and make sure that we can carry out the duties of the council as well as possible.

In the absence of a clerk, Chris Collins has undertaken most of the minuting duties, whilst also continuing his regular council duties. It has fallen to me to act as clerk, as well as Chair, dealing with communications as best I can on a daily basis, trying to respond as quickly and correctly as possible. I must admit this has been a strain, exposing my lack of skills in some aspects of ICT as well as my poor typing skills. However....

I am very proud to be associated with such a fine group of people who covered for the absence of Chair, Vice-chair and clerk so brilliantly.

I don't think many residents really appreciate what Councillors do. It certainly seems to meet the definition of a thankless task, but please be assured that your council is doing the best it can to cover day to day management and maintenance issues, whilst also progressing medium to long term projects.

In summary, the main points covered in the November meeting were

- The proposal by Oliver Symes to plant trees in part of the Sandleaze recreation ground. This had caused a degree of discomfort amongst residents in terms of specific site detail, though the planting of trees is clearly almost universally popular. New areas of land where trees might be planted have been identified on the council land leading down from Sandleaze bank to the stream. Councillors have been actively engaged with Oliver in terms of the best site and how many trees could be planted. This issue is progressing very positively. We are also looking at what might be possible when the new housing estate is built and more funding becomes available.
- We have decided to go ahead with the purchase of two Speed indicator devices (SIDS) as soon as possible, even though we still have no definite date for the work to be done by the engineers appointed by Wiltshire at the 5 sites that we have agreed with them. Councillors have been doing their best to press for this to happen. We have also begun to negotiate with the Devizes LHFIG about other ideas proposed by the village to improve traffic volume and speed issues. We will look at this again in December.
- We have been busy working out our budget for 2022/23 in order to assess how we will use our very limited income. It's important to note that only a very small part of your council tax goes to the village, but we have been very careful to keep the figure as low as possible, chiefly by taking on as much as we can ourselves and providing the service needed for free.
- There was a request from a resident that we consider opening the village hall as a "warm space" for residents to use in the anticipated challenging winter months. Unfortunately, whilst this seems like an excellent idea in principle, it really isn't feasible in practice for a community like ours. This is mainly down to numbers in terms of who would organise and maintain the warm space, how much it would cost, and how many users there would be to make it worthwhile? It's sad, but we simply aren't big enough or well enough resourced.

It has been pointed out to us that the Parish Council hasn't been on top of maintenance issues of late. I felt that this was a rather unfair criticism, but want to take this opportunity not only to defend our position, but also to praise the sterling work of Cllr Powell and his small group of volunteers. We need to prioritise and use our limited access to the parish steward as efficiently as possible, but, in practice, there is only so much we can do. If the number of volunteers were to increase, particularly where there is access to specialist equipment, we could do more. If you take pride in our village environment and are willing to play your part, please get in touch with Malcolm. You will be very welcome.

On a related note, can those of us whose properties border public footpaths and rights of way please do your best to keep them safe and usable for pedestrians? As I have said before, if this presents a problem for you please let us know and we will do our best to assist.

Lastly, a quick heads up that our December meeting will begin at the earlier time of 6pm, but still at the village hall. Councillors are keen to add their tuneful contribution to the seasonal event scheduled to take place at the Rose and Crown on the same evening.
