

Pastoral Letter

We all have our unique goodbyes - times of parting after we have lost someone or something that gave our lives meaning and value.

This month we will celebrate Easter when Jesus prepared his disciples for his death. The way that Jesus says farewell to the disciples helps them take hold of their new life and new relationship with him. It helps them to adapt to the change that this will make to their lives. The fellowship they had shared with him would be no more, so he offers them comfort. There will be no more intimate conversation with Jesus as they wrestle with understanding him and his mission. Now it is their opportunity to work out their own salvation and to discover that God is at work in them. He takes the time to say goodbye so that they may be Easter people with the hope of resurrection and eternal life that he has prepared for them.

After his death and resurrection on the road to Emmaus, two people felt their hearts to be strangely warmed in an hour of empty coldness. Then at a table they met their risen Lord. There they said goodbye to one dream, but began to embrace the possibility of a more profound reality. Aware of resources that, in anguish, they had forgotten, they start to claim the resurrection first his, then theirs. They then began a task that changed this world. A task that has been handed over to us to continue.

Saying hello and goodbye is an integral part of human existence, the necessity of change in order to have growth, and the need to let go before one can truly move on. As a follower of Christ I have discovered that hello always follows goodbye in some form if we allow it. There is, or can be, new life, change is inevitable, although it will be different from the life we knew before. The resurrection of Jesus and the promise of God are too strong to have it be any other way.

This month it is with great sadness and a heavy heart that I am saying goodbye to my role as Rector of the Wellsprings Benefice. I'm not good at saying goodbyes especially when it's not something I want to do. This is a role that I felt called to, that I have loved, and is not something that I thought would come to an end after 5 years of being here. But sometimes we are asked to lay things down and that God knows what is best for us to flourish.

Since my cancer diagnosis 2 years ago and because of my ongoing condition and treatment, I can no longer serve in the way I would want to, so have taken early retirement on grounds of ill-health.

I would love to see you there. 
Cold Road to Imber

Local novelist, Mark Pearson (writing as Jonathan Part) has written a book called 'Cold Road to Imber', set in the 1950s. Kitty, a young Jewish émigrée, has fled with her family to America from Berlin to escape the Nazis. When her father is accused of being a Communist by Senator McCarthy in 1952, she has a change of political heart, returning to East Berlin, where she aims to teach English. But the East German Intelligence Service choose to groom her for espionage. On a trip to Cambridge, where her mission is to find potential, Communist spies, she meets Alec, a headstrong student from the abandoned village of Imber, who has never forgotten the trauma that the villagers suffered in 1943. To Kitty's professional dismay, he steals her heart, leaving her mission exposed. While the ebbing of her political conviction poses the greatest danger of all.







Worton and Marston Garden Club

It's spring and such a busy time for gardeners. Each winter I think I will be much more organised this spring with seeds sown, perennials split and more of our garden renovation achieved. Then - reality strikes; it has been very cold, wet and wintry!

Our speaker Ray Broughton in March was superb. Head of Horticulture at Sparsholt College and an RHS examiner he imparted lots of knowledge and tips for healthy plants and colour in our gardens. An important message for this time of year, reinforced by Ray, is to feed your plants. We all hope for amazing results from our plants, however without feed they soon get tired and less vigorous. A good slow release feed of Seaweed, Blood Fish and Bone or Growmore to start the season for shrubs and perennials and a specific Rose feed in March and repeated in June should give good results. Once borders are planted or weeded, a mulch of home-made compost or a commercial mulch helps to reduce weeds, retain moisture in the soil, slowly feeds the plants and is hugely beneficial.

Brendan has been renovating the 2 containers sited in front of the White Gates as you approach Worton from the West. Worton and Marston Committee have accepted the challenge of planting them. A tricky site and aspect for plants, never mind for those who have to water them! We hope to have them in situ by mid-April. We will be using good compost, drought resistant plants and mulch!! Fingers crossed.

Wiltshire NGS Garden visits rack up in April. Opening for the first time for the NGS is Brow Cottage. Some of you may have visited there during Seend Open Gardens. If not, it is beautifully designed and planted, on our doorstep and well worth a visit. It is open as a combined visit with Seend House at the other end of the village. Further details at ngs.org.uk

I'm very much looking forward to hearing Paul Jupp of Meadow in My Garden our speaker for May. Introducing some wild flowers into the garden is great for beneficial insects of all types and lovely to look at. He is locally based and will have all the knowledge we need to get a good mix for our location.

Maximum Speed Recorded: **45mph** on Monday 20th between 15.30 and 16.15.

Highest Vehicle Count: 346 on Tuesday 21st between 14.45 and 15.30.

These were the first sessions undertaken with both SIDs now operational and early indications are that they are having an effect on vehicle speed in the village.

With longer daylight hours now we will be operating earlier and later in the day and it will be interesting to see how the results compare.

Turnpike

For those of a certain age - and musical taste - their favourite turnpike might well be the New Jersey one on which Paul Simon famously counted cars. However, if you live in Worton, you can count the cars on our very own turnpike, though it's now called the C20- much less romantic. (Mind you, rumour has it that there's a very romantic location nearby - our very own Lovers' Lane, not quite as welcoming now as the hedges have been cut back - it's the footpath that ends in the small layby).

As many of you will know, turnpikes played an important part in improving transport links in Britain. The earliest ones were in the 18th century, but they reached their peak in the 1830's. Turnpike Trusts were set up which raised money to finance road improvement. Tolls were charged to use the roads which would pay back the loans and make money for the trust that administered them. In other words, they were a type of toll road. The trusts were largely abolished by the 1870's, though a small number remain.

The charming building that sits on the bend is Turnpike Cottage and was where the tolls were collected for traffic wishing to use the road as it provided an important route towards Salisbury and other settlements. Of course, the road has been free to use throughout living memory (if anyone has more specific dates when the last tolls were charged we would be delighted to know). The current road layout at Turnpike has been largely unchanged since the early 1960's when the banks were taken back to improve safety on what can still be quite a nasty bend.

Of course, Turnpike Cottage needed to have a "twin" which marked the other end of the turnpike. We believe this to be the building at the junction between Inmarsh Lane and Bell Hill (leading up to the much-lamented Bell Pub with its amazing views). The speed of the turnpike users would thankfully have been much slower than it is today, so maybe they got more value for their money as they enjoyed the rural surroundings!

As suggested above, we would like to cover further points of interest (and potentially interesting Worton residents) in the future and would welcome suggestions, information and personal recollections.

The first thing I need to report on is the continuing success of the SIDS in reducing traffic speed. Whilst the device at the eastern end of the village is certainly slowing traffic, the one at the western end has been even more impressive. We are currently planning the next positions of the two devices which we hope to action in April. (They are heavy and require a team to move, so we continually owe thanks to our neighbours who are improving our lives in this way.)

We are still looking into what can be done to make the traffic issues even better. One idea has been to get a weight restriction of some kind. This idea faces a host of barriers as, although we can present a good case, particularly in terms of numbers of vehicles and the fact that our road is a minor road, the power to make a change is largely at County level. We will continue to make the village voice heard on this issue and will not give up, but we intend to pursue other ideas whilst keeping an eye on national and regional policies which might improve our chances of success.

I have previously referred to the idea of improving pavements within the village. We intend to progress this by having a careful look through the village at locations where a change could be both practical and effective. If anyone has any ideas on this, please let us know (<u>clerk@worton.org.uk</u>). It is very unlikely that any change would happen for at least a couple of years, so there is plenty of time for proper consultation on what could be a sensitive issue.

On a related point, we have been reconsidering proposals for improvement at the notorious Black Dog crossroads. Various proposals have been considered and strong feelings have understandably been stirred on what is a very important issue. Unsurprisingly choices come down to a combination of costs, practicality and effectiveness. We are, along with several other interested parties, endeavouring to get the best result as soon as possible.

It's probably a good time to remind everyone to please maintain your vegetation growth when it interferes with pavements and footpaths. Of course, this is very much a seasonal issue, but we need to be sure pedestrians are safe, especially those with mobility issues and those using pushchairs. Please take this as a polite reminder and request!

Still on the environment, Patricia is sharing information about the next stage of the tree planting initiative begun by Oliver Symes which is taking a delightful form. Please see below.

Finally, and to my great relief (!), we have a new clerk in post. Having interviewed a number of candidates, we are delighted to appoint Jules Slack who lives in the village and will be familiar to many of you. Our former clerk, Liz Starling, was, of course, excellent in the post and will be missed, but I'm sure Jules will soon put her own stamp on the role and we are all looking forward to working with her.

How criminals get your trust to scam you

Social engineering is a technique criminals use to get you to trust them, and then convince you to give away your money or confidential information

3 ways they may do this

- Phishing, Vishing and Smishing these are fake emails, phone calls or text messages supposedly from a friend or family member or even a trusted organisation. They're used to get you to give scammers your personal or financial information.
- Remote access this is when a criminal tricks you into letting them take control of your device. They do
 this by getting you to click on a link or download an app which gives them access to everything on it.
- Pressure this happens when a scammer puts pressure on you to pay for something quickly, for example, a limited time offer. They're trying to panic you into making a payment without thinking it through.

What to look out for

- Never assume someone contacting you is genuine caller ID and email addresses can be spoofed to appear genuine.
- · Is an offer or sale too good to be true?
- Never download an app, click on links or open attachments without taking time to think about if it's
 genuine.
- · An email, call or text message to say your device has a virus or your antivirus software is out of date.
- Be very wary of requests to pay by bank transfer. Always use the secure payment method recommended by reputable online retailers.

Climate change – the effect on gender equality

The theme for International Women's Day (8 March) this year was "Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow."

According to **UN Women**, advancing global gender equality in the context of climate change and disaster risk reduction is one of the 'greatest global challenges' of the 21st century.

The reason? Roles as primary caregivers and providers of food and fuel make women more vulnerable when flooding and drought occur. Men go to the towns, leaving them to look after the community. Women are then working harder to feed and care for their families without support. Girls often have to leave school to help their mothers manage the increased burden.

Jocelyne Razafiarivony, the **Mothers' Union** provincial coordinator for Madagascar, speaking about the relationship between climate change and gender inequality at the UNCSW66, said: "Because of famine, the men left the region to go to the capital of Madagascar in a massive rural exodus. Women could not go anywhere. They were a burden so they had to stay. As caregivers, they were not able to feed their families any longer. They were only eating cactus and boiled water. They were really starving."

So, climate change isn't just changing our weather; its consequences are a daily reality for millions of people. When women and girls are displaced, they are also at greater risk of violence, including sexual violence, the tragic reality of their lives as migrants or refugees, the increased danger of human and child trafficking, and early and forced marriage, which women and girls on the move endure.

However, many organisations now advocate that women must be part of the solution. **Women Deliver** says: "The first step towards tackling the challenges of climate change is empowering women to safeguard the environment": https://womendeliver.org/investment/invest-women-tackle-climate-change-conserve-environment/ and The **World Economic Forum** reports that when women are involved in decision making about the climate more effective and equitable outcomes are generated: https://www.weforum.org/agenda/2022/02/women-gender-equality-climate-change-leadership/ (continued on next page)



Shared Lives: Home from Hospital

I am sure that many of us will have heard about or had some personal experience of Ambulance waiting times at A&E this winter. Wiltshire Council is working closely with the NHS to reduce A&E waiting times with a new support service to help people who are medically fit to leave hospital and continue their recovery in a safe environment while regaining the daily living skills and confidence they need to return to their own home.

The Shared Lives Home from Hospital Service enables people to stay and be cared for, in the home of a Shared Lives carer for up to 12 weeks before either returning to their own home to live independently or moving to somewhere that can provide the ongoing support they need. The Home from Hospital Service means people don't have to stay in hospital when they are ready to leave, and as well as creating a more supportive and homely environment; it also means more hospital beds are available for those who need them.

There are many reasons why people ready to leave hospital cannot return to their own home immediately. They may be waiting for adaptations to their home to make it suitable, require day to day support to continue their recovery following medical conditions such as a stroke, or need to learn how to manage a long-term condition and there is no one at home to assist them. It could also be because they are waiting for the start of home care services or have had a period of mental ill health which required a hospital admission. It could be older people needing more time to recover, and regain their strength and confidence, following a hospital stay.

Wiltshire Council needs more Shared Lives carers to help deliver this very important service. The job is very flexible with carers able to work in their own home and fit around family life. Shared Lives carers do not need qualifications as training is provided but it helps to have a wide range of life experience.

- Shared Lives carers are paid £850 per week, per person for the Home from Hospital service.
- Carers are self-employed and eligible for tax breaks and can claim
- They have access to Wiltshire Council shopping rewards scheme and discounts at Wiltshire Council leisure facilities.
- They have membership of Shared Lives Plus.

Can you help ensure that our hospitals can run more efficiently, our nurses and doctors are not run ragged and most importantly that people are able to recuperate well? More information is at Becoming a carer-Wiltshire Council. Thank you.

Village Hall News

Jumble Sale - Thanks to all of you who contributed items for sale at the Jumble Sale and/or came along in the afternoon. We took just over £300 which was a bit disappointing when compared with previous years but satisfactory considering the financial climate at the moment and the fact that the weather wasn't on our side. This money will go to the general coffers rather than the Kitchen Fund as the former has been depleted somewhat by the rising costs of oil and electricity. We hope those of you who came had an enjoyable afternoon and managed to pick up a bargain or two.

Christmas Bazaar - We have been asked to publish the amount raised by the Christmas Bazaar held at the beginning of December 2022. I apologise that this was not done sooner. The amount was £507 all of which went into the Kitchen Fund.

Kitchen Fund - Thanks to a very generous pledge of support from Worton Parish Council, the Kitchen Fund is progressing well and the confirmed funds currently stand at £47,000. We have also just submitted a grant application for a further £11,700.
