

Worton Parish Council

If anything arises that might be considered as significant beyond the ordinary then we hold an extraordinary meeting, As I write this we haven't needed to meet formally. We both taught in schools in the London area before moving to Wiltshire, where we both worked in local schools. We have lived in Worton since the early 1990's. Put simply, we fell in love with the place and were exceptionally lucky to be able to move from Devizes when we did. Nothing wrong with Devizes of course, but we wanted to sample village life.

Our good fortune was in the form of the others who took up resi-

I've also become used to resolving disagreements - fortunately not needed often, and I'm quite good at organising.

Both Sarah and I see our futures in the village. Whilst Essex continues to have a pull for Sarah in the form of her redoubtable father, our children now have their own roots in the area and our recent membership of the grandparent club has given us a rather important enhancement to our lives that we want to enjoy from a close proximity!

A group of cyclists who completed a 100 mile trip from Wiltshire to Devon have raised £30,000 for the Stars Appeal at Salisbury District Hospital. The so-called Unlikely Cyclists have 12 members who took on their challenge over two days last month.

William Warden brought them together after his wife Sarah was diagnosed with breast cancer last year and cared for at the Stars Appeal funded Breast Unit. He said: "Sarah was diagnosed with Breast Cancer in late 2022 and while sitting in Salisbury Hospital's Breast Unit, one grey and damp morning, I read through the list of companies and individuals who had donated to fund the unit to provide a calm and peaceful atmosphere for treatment, and I felt I would like to do something to help. The care Sarah received from the dedicated team of nurses was faultless."

William says the group's initial fundraising target was £5,000: "We never envisaged getting anywhere near that amount. To get over £30,000 we were astonished. We hope it will make a difference to a lot of people. We can't thank everyone who supported us enough."

The Stars Appeal aims to raise over £1 million each year to fund projects offering direct, practical support to patients, their families, and the Hospital's staff. Alongside its Breast Unit the charity has provided the Hospital with additional CT and MRI scanners and a range of new facilities including an enhanced Children's Unit and Cardiac Suite. Donations also help fund projects supporting cancer patients, including free aromatherapy, headwear for patients who lose their hair, free drinks for chemotherapy and oncology outpatients, and a prehabilitation programme offering one-to-one support to help patients prepare for surgery and treatment.

Dave Cates, of the Stars Appeal, said: "We are so grateful to William and Sarah, and all of the cyclists and their supporters, for raising such an incredible sum for our charity. It will enable us to continue our work enhancing care for thousands of patients every week at Salisbury Hospital and supporting their families and the NHS staff that care for them."

FIVE LANES WI

On 9th August we met back in the Village Hall having had 2 meetings away from the village.

Helen had had a letter of thanks from Dorothy House for the money raised from selling Rosemary's craft materials and finished items. In total we had given them £1463. Any more raised in the future will go to the Village Hall and Five Lanes WI.

We welcomed Susan Simpson who gave us a short history of paper bead making. Since learning the craft and beginning demonstrating, she has joined the Heritage Craft Association, where she has rubbed shoulders with some of the team from The Repair Shop! Apparently Victorian ladies were some of the first to try this craft, using wallpaper and newspaper wrapped round knitting needles. Shaped strips of paper are wound round needles or nowadays, boat pins, so you can slide the paper strip in and hold it tight while you wind.

There was a resurgence in the 1920s and these often had a dab of perfume on the last layer to make expensive scent last longer! There was discussion on such beads being found in some African countries and further back among the Mayans.

Susan had some beautiful examples of finished and glazed beads made into necklaces, bracelets and earrings, after several layers of glazing have been applied. We then all had a try at rolling up the paper strips into beads, applying a little glue every few turns. We all enjoyed some measure of success and thoroughly enjoyed the challenge, alongside much chatter, of course.

Our September meeting will be on WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 13th at 7:00pm in the Village Hall when we will welcome a chocolatier from HOLLYCHOCKS in Poulshot. There will be a small charge for this meeting so if you would like to make this your first visit to our WI, give me a ring as numbers may be limited!


