Thanks again for everyone who has volunteered and helped to maintain the village open spaces and footpaths.

The footpath between the Church and Cedar Close was first upgraded as part of a Millennium project over 23 years ago. Over the years grass has gradually taken over leaving a narrow path, making access difficult and keeping the grass strimmed has become a major effort.

Wiltshire Council have agreed to give us some Cerney gravel so that we can reinstate the original width of the footpath. My aim is to remove the grass from the existing path, locating the edge boards, and then top dress with a layer of gravel tamped down with a compactor plate borrowed from WC.

Work will start Monday 8th August. Volunteers welcome. Please bring your own tools.

Pastoral Letter

Maureen's Ramblings......

Gosh – how I have missed travelling over the past few years! But what a lot of memories I have been able to draw upon - fed by 1000's of photos! (ADVERT – at 7.00 on 15 Sept. in Seend Pavilion, I am presenting another travel evening – this time about Chile - a wonderful country of contrasts. Please come along!) I loved Chile! A strong memory is of the seals and dolphins I saw in their natural habitat - basking in the sun, then in and out of the water, riding the surf and having such a good time; twisting, rolling and playing in the waves. I could almost see the smile on their faces! The native parrots in Brazil were also so colourful and playful - swooping low and noisily; enjoying the rush of wind over their wings as they braked suddenly to change course; chasing one another through the branches of the trees.

Does God play, I wonder? The One who created the playful flipper, the fun-filled swoop, must surely do what his creatures do. Maybe some animals were created out of God's playfulness: the oddly shaped platypus, the camel with its hump, the mischievous monkey and the long-necked gi-

raffe. Yes – I think that God is playful! God does have a sense of humour! God likes fun!

But how often in history people have created God in their own image - sometimes as a dour and tyrannical fun hater, eager for our obedience and conformity to exacting moral standards, hovering over us in judgement when we fail. How often the church has seemed dull and miserable, with lifted eyebrows should the sound of laughter or the sight of dancing break upon it. Have we missed something here? Perhaps the capacity to play and have fun is part of God's plan for us! Perhaps it is one of the ways in which we refresh and nourish our souls. Perhaps joy and laughter are fundamental to our faith in a creative, fun-loving God.

It was God who had the idea of the Sabbath rest – one day in the week put aside for time out from our busy, stressful lives; one day a week to be used for worship, rest and recreation, for refreshment and renewal. Sadly, this has rather been debased over the years - with every day looking like the next. But I think God got it right because we all need time to play and to laugh and to en-

joy, and, like the seals and the parrots, take a break from the constant work of food gathering and nest building.

How much more creative and joyful our life and our relationships and our churches would be if there was more laughter and playfulness. And, as with Newton and his apple and Archimedes and his bath, some of the world's great discoveries have happened during a period of rest and playfulness. The seals and parrots remind me some important things. I need to give myself more space and permission to just have fun; to be creative and to laugh. And I need to rejoice more in the playful love of my Creator.



ECO-CORNER

Reversing the Nature Crisis

Sir James Bevan, Chief Executive of the Environment Agency, began his speech on 12 July by quoting from the opening lines of Rachel Carson's Silent Spring, the 1962 book that sparked the modern environmental movement.

"There was once a town in the heart of America where all life seemed to live in harmony with its surroundings. Then a strange blight crept over the area. Everywhere was a shadow of death. It was a spring without voices. On the mornings that had once throbbed with the dawn chorus of robins, doves, jays, wrens, and scores of other bird voices there was now no sound; only silence lay over the fields and woods and marsh. No witchcraft, no enemy action had silenced the rebirth of new life in this stricken world. The people had done it themselves.

Sir James went on: "Sixty years on we are closer than ever to that silent spring happening....

Since 1970, 41% of our species have decreased in abundance and 15% of all our native species in the island of Britain are now threatened with extinction.

The position is even worse for the mammals, birds, butterflies and moths designated as priority species – those about which we have the greatest concern. They have declined in abundance overall by 61% since 1970. Since that date butterflies and moths have decreased in average abundance by 16% and 25% respectively."

Members of the public are currently being encouraged to join The Big Butterfly Count, a UK-wide survey aimed at helping to access the health of our environment simply by counting the amount and type of butterflies (and some day-flying moths) we see. The Count is intended as well as an early warning system helping scientists understand how environmental changes are affecting insects.

First, you can download the handy butterfly ID chart or free app for iOS and Android to identify and record the butterflies you see. Then between 15 July and 7 August you just need to choose a place to spot butterflies and moths. Watch for 15 minutes. Then record which spe-

cies you observe and look at the interactive map provided to find how your data is contributing to conservation science and research.



Close Season Stocktake!

As for all football clubs, the close season is a time to wind down and recharge for players. However, it is a surprisingly busy time for coaches and the committee as they take stock of the team kit status and start planning immediately for the new season. Time also for player registration. 

Carer Support Wiltshire - information and upcoming dates

If you look after, or help to look after, someone who could not otherwise live independently without your support, then you are an unpaid carer. You might be caring for a partner, parent, child, friend or neighbour who is elderly, has a disability or an illness – including a mental health illness or an addiction to alcohol or drugs.

If you look after someone you love or care about you might not consider yourself a carer. Caring is something we do often without question, or the need for a label. But it can be useful to acknowledge your role so that you can ensure you're receiving all the support available to you and taking care of your own needs.

Carer Support Wiltshire offers advice and support to those who are caring for someone. This often starts with an assessment to determine what impact a carer's role is having on their own health and wellbeing. They run a number of groups and carer cafes where carers can meet up and offer support to one another. These groups can help with feelings of loneliness and isolation that many carers experience. There is always a member of CSW staff or a trained volunteer on hand to answer any questions you may have and often there are guest speakers too. It's always frustrating just how long it seems to take for things "to be done". In contrast, it doesn't take long to realise why this is the case. Even the best ideas will have issues linked to them that may or may not be obvious. Which brings me to the perennial topic of traffic volume and speed.

Firstly, the SIDS project. Cllr Slack and I recently had an on site meeting with Donna Kelly who is the engineer responsible for the process of siting and installing the posts which the devices will be fixed to. This provided literally on the ground insight into exactly what is involved, from determining the exact spot on which a post could be sited, the ground's ownership, ensuring access for pedestrians, judging height, width, visibility plus potential knock on effects, not to mention legal issues and relative cost implications. We fine tuned the existing site ideas and came to a consensus. There should be 6 sites, located along the length of the village, designed to have the most effect and least disruption. There will be 2 SIDS which will be regularly moved between the sites. We will be following agreed guidelines in this respect. We are very grateful to Bob and the village Speedwatch team for their on-going support in this regard. Donna gave Richard and I assurance that we will see the SIDS in action in September, if not before.

In a related issue, we are keeping a close eye on the on-going Autospeedwatch saga. There are certainly positive noises in this regard, but the advice is still to adopt a "wait and see" stance until the detail of the Wiltshire Police policy is clearer. We are not the only village applying pressure in this regard, so fingers crossed. Our intention is to join the scheme as soon as we have clarity.

While on the subject, please let myself or one of the other councillors know if you would like a "twenty is better" poster, which should arrive soon.

Still on traffic, most residents will be aware of the local accident black spot, colloquially known as "Black Dog". There has been some progress on this following research by the responsible engineers which has produced a recommendation which we have been asked to respond to. Whilst far short of some of the suggestions made by ourselves and other interested parties, this has become something of a"

fait accompli" which we have decided to accept as it would certainly make the junction safer and is achievable. Please ask myself or one of the other councillors if you would like more detail.

By now, many of you will have been able to enjoy the "new" section of the WORT11 footpath. This has been the result of real team effort led by Cllr Goodenough with support from Tamara Reay, Wiltshire Area Board and, of course, local residents. I am proud of the work councillors have put into this, sometimes under extreme pressure.

As we move forward, the new Village Plan, presented by Cllr Powell following consultation will be at the heart of what we do. This has already been shared, but please ask if you would like to know more.


I'd like to mention just how proud I was of our village during the Open Gardens event (well done gardening club). We had guests staying with us who were delighted, fascinated and impressed, not just with the gardens but also the many people they met. This makes it ironic that we are still experiencing problems with vegetation overgrowing the pavement, especially at one or two points on the High Street. Can I once again appeal to householders to maintain this growth to make the pathway safer? If this presents a problem, please let us know and we will provide help via our Village Maintenance group.

A quick mention to an event happening nearby in August, with Keevil hosting a National gliding championship. This could potentially cause some local road disruption.

I'd like to add a brief personal note. It really feels like our village has lost so much of its heart recently as we continue without so many loved and respected village personalities. The way our community pulls together and supports each other is very special.

After two decidedly different and unusual festivals due to Covid and Covid restrictions, the Edington Music Festival returns on Sunday August 21st for its official 65th outing.

The festival will run for its usual eight days – Sunday 21st to Sunday 28th August, with four services a day, three choirs of top-flight singers under three of the country's leading choral directors, all under the direction of a new Festival Director, Robert Quinney, Director of the Choir at New College Oxford (and former Festival Organist and Director of the Nave Choir.)
