

Our friendship began in Lent, for me as a Christian, moved into Ramadan, for them as Muslims, through into Holy Week and Easter and on into Eid. From sharing the breaking of the fast at sunset through Ramadan to enjoying the gift of Easter eggs, we have enjoyed friendship and fun together as well as sharing in our sadnesses.

As the old African proverb goes, 'Eat and drink together: talk and laugh together: enjoy life together: but never call it friendship until you have wept together'.

Yesterday, we shared a car journey together as, stepping out of my comfort zone, I drove (in torrential rain!) to Easton in Bristol to shop, so my friend could bulk buy all the familiar foods from home to continue cooking traditional meals for her lovely family.

Sometimes life can take you by surprise, in a good way. Finding common ground, can lead to lasting friendships, if we are willing to move out of the familiar and step out of our comfort zones.

As reported last month, now that we own the land at Northbrook we have completed the demolition of the old club house, switching off and making safe the utilities ahead of rebuilding. Our thanks to G A Potter and son for the demolition and Grist Environmental for allowing us to dispose of the rubbish at a competitive rate. We have an outline design for the new building, which we expect will be a metal fame structure, which will be turned into construction plans so we can apply for planning permission. Once approved, we can apply for grants to fund the new clubhouse, building on the ~£10,000 we have already raised to date.

# **Worton Parish Council**

We have now agreed our Parish Plan which will provide the backdrop to the work undertaken by the council ... on top of the normal ongoing "maintenance" overseeing finance, planning, environment etc.

I'm indebted to Cllr Powell for his efforts into putting the plan into shape having taken into account the issues and concerns raised by residents which, unsurprisingly, remain fairly constant through the years.

The Plan comprises seven proposals which we unanimously support. In simple outline these are :-

- 1. To establish a new pedestrian crossing site along the High Street connecting pavements on either side of the road.
- 2. To change the speed limit to 40mph on the eastern approach to the village.
- 3. New roundels painted at the western edge of the village and renovation of the pedestrian crossing place by Cedar Close.
- 4. To engage with Newland Homes to ensure that the stretch of road around the planned access point is as safe as possible.
- 5. To install a new socket for a SID device location between Gaisford and Sandleaze.
- 6. To purchase and install Auto Speedwatch.
- 7. To extend and resurface footpath WORT13 in order to provide a safe access route for pedestrians as an alternative to the High Street.

This may seem to be an ambitious list, but we consider all to be practical as long as support is forthcoming. Finance is, of course, limited, but there is a very realistic expectation that we will be in a much stronger position following the completion of the Newland Homes project which we now expect to begin in October. Our engagement with Newland has been constructive and they have shown willingness to engage in dialogue. We will be presenting our case to them at an appropriate time and, as all of the above proposals would have clear benefits to potential residents in the new development, we are hopeful that we would get a positive response!

In addition, Wiltshire Council finances will receive significant financial boost from the development which, whilst not required to be spent on Worton projects, ought to be a factor when we seek to gain financial and practical support at that level.

I would like to take this opportunity to clarify what our aims are in relation to footpath WORT13. You will notice that I am not referring to Back Lane, which is only part of the route along the southern edge of the village, though the footpath route obviously uses it. Our main interest is improving the western end which has been difficult for people to use and can be literally linked to planned infrastructure resulting from the new development. As yet, we don't know what could be possible, manageable or desirable but we will want to involve anyone with an interest in whatever form. Nothing has been decided yet!

As a council we are always looking for ways that funding can be sourced to support projects. Once again, I must stress that the funding we get via the Precept, which makes up a tiny proportion of the Council Tax we all pay, is relatively meagre, meaning that we have to set our stall sensibly in terms of what we hope to achieve -hence the importance of any "windfall" that might come our way linked to housing developments. We do not wish to increase the amount we ask for from residents when alternative funding streams can be tapped into. That is why we are having to delay the installation of our Jubilee Walkway plaque, as the support we had hoped for has not been forthcoming. Patricia is doing a great job at applying pressure at County level, so we remain hopeful.

Thanks to Rob Goss and his family we are moving forward with our plans in relation to King's Copse which will form a facility for residents which truly reflects the more positive side of the era we are living in. We will be able to enjoy our environment whilst allowing the surrounding land to still be used productively.

Councillors have been actively involved in trying to resolve issues that have been raised in relation to footpaths, drainage etc, with positive results in this respect. However, it cannot be our

role to become involved in disagreements that arise between neighbours - unless the Parish Council is directly involved.

From my personal perspective, I find it very sad that neighbours cannot resolve any differences amicably, but then, perhaps, I am something of an idealist. All villages - indeed all communities - will have their local issues which are very hard to resolve because they are so immediate and pressing. I have therefore been upset by recent developments that have occurred in relation to a specific location in the village and its management. Procedures are in place to resolve concerns about issues such as land use. I understand that these have now been followed in relation to this issue.

We discussed the letter from Roger Wilshire that appeared in the July edition of the Bridge. I believe that Bob Mitchell intends to respond on behalf of Speedwatch, but I feel a word or two of support is due from the Parish Council as well.

I must admit that when we worked out the number of vehicles passing through the village we were somewhat taken aback, so we checked several times. In fact, it's a simple sum. The SIDS record the number of vehicles that go past in a given time period, so all that is needed is simple multiplication; times the number recorded each day by 365 and there you are! Of course, there are flaws in this, as it assumes that the day used is typical. If we wanted to show that measures to reduce traffic were working well and an excellent investment we would choose December 25th and multiply that! However, that isn't the case here and, if anything, the figure quoted may be on the conservative side.

I would like, yet again, to praise our Speedwatch team for all they do. We are the envy of many other villages and the way the concerns over traffic are being highlighted is seeing real results. We should all appreciate what they do on our behalf to make our village safer.

Lastly, we still have a spot available on the Parish Council. There are exciting times ahead as we see some of the biggest



# **Worton Community Speedwatch – June 2023**

(Wiltshire Speedwatch sessions are restricted to 45 minutes)

Sessions: **ELEVEN** 

Total Vehicles Counted: 4,092

Vehicles recorded for exceeding the 30mph speed limit: <u>232</u> of which <u>48</u> were reported to Wiltshire Police for excess speed.

Maximum Speed Recorded: 43mph on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> June between 07.15 and 08.00, and Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June Between 15.45 and 16.30.

Highest vehicle count <u>436</u> on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June between 07.15 and 08.00

(The comparable figures for JUNE 2022 were: Sessions 14 Vehicles 4,712 with 449 vehicles exceeding 30mph of which 110 were reported for excess speed.)

# **SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES (SIDs)**

From Wiltshire Police:

The use of data recorded by SIDs across Wiltshire and Swindon to inform Force deployment of enforcement activities is a published requirement within the police and crime plan.

A pilot has successfully been conducted from January to June 2023. The pilot group was made up of 11 SIDs and data has been extracted by volunteers on a monthly basis. This data has been emailed by the volunteers to Wiltshire Police. This enables the police to assess speeds on an hourly/daily/weekly and monthly basis at all locations covered by the SIDs. During the pilot, c1.8million vehicles have been recorded.

Worton Speed Indicator Devices

Now that the pilot project has been completed it has been expanded across the county and data from our SIDs will be emailed to Wiltshire Police for inclusion. Analysis of the data will enable Wiltshire Police to deploy their traffic enforcement teams more effectively.



# Help shape the future of Wiltshire

Wiltshire Council is considering the review of the Wiltshire Local Plan. The draft Plan sets out the vision and framework for housing, infrastructure and land for employment growth for the next 15 years. Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the Plan, making it the most important place-shaping document for Wiltshire.

It also identifies sites for housing and employment development until 2038. There is good news in that following further work to assess the number of homes needed, the number of planned homes in the Plan has been significantly reduced from its last iteration by almost 9000. When the Plan was consulted on in 2021, it proposed 45,630 homes over 20 years to 2036, but the updated Plan proposes 36,740 homes, of which over 21,900 homes have already been built or are committed.

A number of important policies are included in the draft plan:

- 40% of all new housing on developments of 10 homes or more to be affordable.
- Greater flexibility for rural exception sites to make it easier to provide affordable housing in villages where there is clearly identified demand.
- New developments will have to meet zero carbon standards, including energy generation such as solar panels.
- 20% biodiversity net gain for all new developments, compared to the 10% legal requirement.
- All new developments must also have cycling and walking connections.

Most of the housing development is planned to be in the major urban centres in the county, with Devizes needing to plan for only an additional 40 homes, when existing completions and commitments are taken into account. Potterne, Seend and Worton are considered to be large villages in the housing plan and some development will ensure that these communities can continue to thrive and meet local housing needs.

This Local Plan is about providing for a choice of high-quality designed housing, including affordable homes, in the most sustainable

locations; maximising development on brownfield sites; supporting town centres; and providing high quality new public open spaces.



# **Traffic Flow on Worton High Street**

In response to Roger Wilshire's letter in July's Bridge with regard to traffic numbers through the village the following figures give an indication of the number of vehicles we record.

On Monday 15<sup>th</sup> of May in the course of two 45 minute sessions, total 90 minutes, the Community Speedwatch team recorded 1,109 vehicles. On Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> of May the total was 1,105. The average figure per session for the week was 512.

The Speed Indicator Device located at the eastern end of the village by Sandleaze Court monitors vehicle flow 24 hours a day and the table shows a breakdown of figures for the period 28<sup>th</sup> May to 25<sup>th</sup> June. The total count downloaded from this SID is 102,688.
