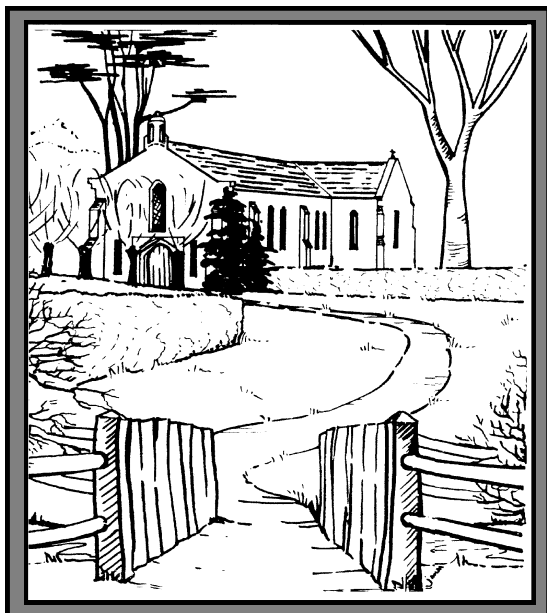

Many thanks to all who contributed in any way to make it such a lovely day.

Following the great events taking place in the villages over Jubilee weekend, an outdoor (we just made it in dry weather!) Jubilee Praise was held in the churchyard, with some very exuberant flag waving, along with singing some of the Queen's favourite songs, and hymns which had been sung at various royal events. Tea and cake and lots of chat followed, with the children being entertained by Rev. Adrian creating balloon animals.

We continue to pray for Rev Ali, along with others in the villages who are undergoing treatment, or are unwell, and for those who have recently died and their families.

Worton Parish Council

Firstly, I am delighted to welcome Patricia Goodenough as our newest Councillor. She brings a wealth of skills and experience to our team and we are very pleased to have her on board. I am now able to confirm that the Council is complete, with the exception of the post of clerk, which is still unfilled. We have decided to return to this in September when the situation could be clearer.

We have had two meetings since my last chance to communicate in the Bridge. There is no doubt that the issue of Traffic continues to be at the foremost of residents' concerns, as it seems to have been for many years.

The Annual Parish meeting was deliberately designed to provide an opportunity for both specific concerns and possible solutions to be shared. The Parish Meeting was well attended and parishioners were very clear, and indeed, passionate about how worried they were about traffic volume and speed. This reflected feelings aired at the recent meeting with our MP, Danny Kruger, at the Rose and Crown.

Please be assured that your Parish Council shares your concerns, listens to all ideas and seeks to progress them with the authorities that have the power and resources to "make things happen". We work closely with the Speedwatch team and Cllrs Bonfield, Slack and Parsons in particular have shown resilience and skill in their attempts to bring about tangible improvements in the situation. We are also very grateful for the support shown by Cllr Tamara Reay.

So what's the latest?

We have been repeatedly assured that the Installation of the Speed Indicator Devices is scheduled and funded and that we are simply awaiting availability of the necessary officers and staff to make it happen. We continue to press politely on this.

We have also ordered some new "30mph" stickers that can be fixed on bins to remind motorists of the speed limit. Please contact Suzanne, Dicky or myself if you would like one (or two!). Another suggestion was the use of "Twenty is Plenty" signage. We are working on producing some of these "in house" which should be available soon. It is important to note that these can only be used within the grounds of a private property, but it is quite possible to achieve a

prominent effect in suitable locations. Please let Suzanne, Dicky or myself know if you are interested.

A wide range of other ideas were put forward and subsequently considered. Some of these are of particular interest. Examples include :-

Widening the pavement, achieving safer pedestrian access and narrowing the road, thus slowing traffic.

Lowering the weight limit permitted on the road.

Renewing the coloured road surfaces at strategic points.

Having “roundels” painted on the road surface at strategic points

We have decided to make enquiries about how these could be actioned. Whilst all of the above were discussed during the meeting that took place recently between Cllr Bonfield and Gareth Rogers, the responsible Officer from Wiltshire Council, it is fairly clear that the logistical and cost implications vary greatly between them. In other words, some are more immediately feasible than others.

One piece of very welcome news that Suzanne shared with us at the Annual Parish meeting was that Wiltshire Police appear to have agreed to use the data produced by Autospeedwatch systems to identify and follow up incidents recorded. Previously the data was only being used for statistical purposes. We are seeking further confirmation before acting, but if proved correct could be a real “game changer”.

One issue that arose at the meeting was the problem caused by vegetation overhanging from private properties and blocking parts of the pavement, which could clearly cause problems and is potentially dangerous. So, a polite request that residents whose properties border the pedestrian footway to cut back overhanging growth as soon as possible. Please let Cllr Powell know if this presents a particular difficulty for you and we can see if help can be provided.

Whilst on the subject of Footpaths, we are still expecting improvements on WORT11/MARS 9 to begin very soon, having agreed a new quote from the contractors appointed by Wiltshire Council. Whilst the increase in the quote and very short timescale we were working on caused some disquiet (and our dissatisfaction was made clear at the time), on balance it has been decided to accept the quote with some reluctance in order that the sterling work put into the project by all in-

volved should not go to waste. Particular thanks go to our new Councillor, Patricia Goodenough, in this respect. Whilst funding is in place to cover the majority of the costs, there is still some shortfall and I know that Patricia is still working hard to make up the gap.

Cllr Powell has outlined our Parish Plan for the next three years. Obviously improving the traffic situation is firmly at the top of the agenda, but Malcolm has also been taking steps to improve the village environment via the Village maintenance group which has made an excellent beginning thanks to the interest shown by the community. This also forms an important aspect of the Plan. We also have a close eye on what we can do to improve the facilities in the playgrounds. Whilst Neighbourhood Plan considerations are within the Plan, we are very much under the influence of wider developments, so there is little detail in this regard at the present. Malcolm has also reminded us of a proposal to establish a new walking guide to the village, featuring local landmarks and “folklore”. We will return to this when we get the chance!

Lastly, as mentioned above, we are still operating without a Parish Clerk, though Liz Starling is continuing in the Responsible Finance Officer part of the job. Whilst this is the case, members of the council are needing to carry out tasks significantly out of their comfort zone! Please bear with us. We are doing our best, but you may need to be patient with us at times!

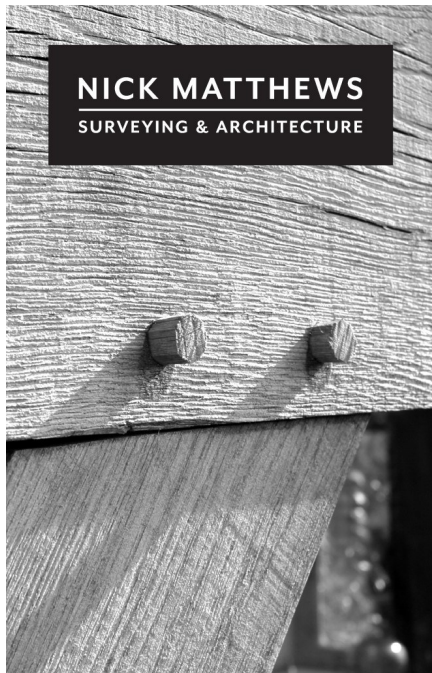

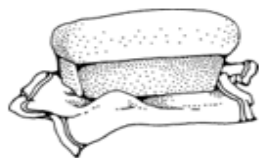

- 40Z. DARK SOFT BROWN SUGAR.

- 1 EGG - BEATEN.
- HALF A TEASPOON OF MIXED SPICES.

ECO-CORNER

Water is a precious resource

97.5% of the world's water is located in seas and oceans, too salty for our use. Most of the remaining 2.5 % is in the ice caps. So we depend on the tiny bit available as fresh water – essential for life. The average UK household currently uses around 330 litres of water daily – that's 140 litres per person every day.

Climate breakdown is one of the biggest causes of water shortages. In England, according to the UK Environmental Agency, we face water shortages by 2050 - unless we save water fast. The link between water and climate is being accelerated by climate change because floods, droughts and heat directly impact the availability of the water that humans need. Changing the way we use water will help strengthen our planet's ecosystems and reduce the risk of extreme water events that make water more unpredictable and scarce.

Preservation of water should be an objective of each of us; no government or institution can save water unless we want to.

So what can we do? There are many ways we can save water around the home. Some examples:

In the kitchen: wait until you have a full load before using your washing machine or dishwasher; only fill the kettle with the amount of water needed; cover saucepans to reduce water loss during heating; fix dripping taps that can waste 15 litres of water a day.

In the bathroom: turn the tap off while brushing your teeth (a running tap can waste more than 6 litres of water a minute); take a shower instead of a bath; spend one minute less in the shower each day - every minute in a power shower uses up to 17 litres of water.

In the garden: use a watering can instead of a sprinkler or hosepipe which, left running, can use between 500 and 1000 litres of water an hour; use a water butt to catch rainwater and use this to water your plants; plant drought-resistant plants.

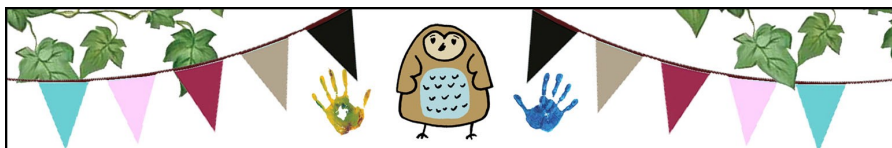

A Message from Tamara Reay Wiltshire Councillor for The Devizes Rural West Division

This month, I wanted to highlight some very important (although slightly dry!) pieces of work at Wiltshire Council.

Wiltshire Council's Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee has published its annual report - having investigated many important issues for Wiltshire throughout the year. The committee, made up of a number of non-executive councillors, ensures that Council decisions are taken on sound evidence. It is focused on what it looks at so that it can add value to the most important services provided by the Council, its partners and contractors. Wherever possible it helps to shape policy through early discussions as well as scrutinising proposals before they are finally agreed.

The 2021/22 annual report highlights a number of the key projects it has worked on throughout that period, including the Council's Business Plan, the Council's budget and opposition amendments, and proposed changes to Area Boards. As well as the overall Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee, there are three specialist select committees that cover health and social care, the environment, and children and families.

Also, last month, the Council published the results of independent reports by Anthesis Group of a detailed technical assessment of progress towards the climate change ambitions for the Council and the County to be carbon neutral by 2030. On its ambitions for the organisation itself to be carbon neutral by 2030, Anthesis found that Wiltshire Council is in a very strong position to meet its carbon neutral commitment by 2030. The main focus of the report was on the Council's direct emissions, and it showed that the Council has reduced its carbon footprint by 81% since 2014/15, and the projects currently in the pipeline should help get that to a 90% reduction by 2030. With further investment in offsetting, the Council should reach its carbon neutral target by 2030.

Anthesis also reviewed the county's overall ambition to be carbon neutral by 2030. The report clearly demonstrated that although Wiltshire Council will play a key role in helping the county to be carbon neutral, everyone from individuals, organisations, businesses and central gov-

ernment will need to play their part and step up to provide support. It was great therefore to join the Devizes Sustainability Fair in Devizes Market Place on Saturday 11 June and see the brilliant plans and initiatives being developed by many local groups across the Devizes area. 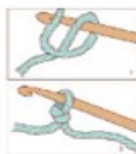

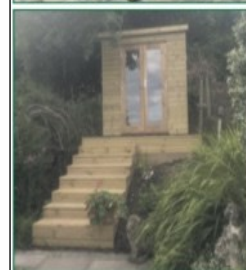
