

What extraordinary times these are. With the sad passing of our Queen, we have come, in the truest sense, to the end of an era. It's unusual to experience such an acutely shared emotion of shock, which has added to the many losses we have experienced as a community recently.

I will confess that the protocols and ceremony associated with the Queen's passing and King Charles' accession somewhat caught me out and I wasn't aware of some duties I apparently had until far too late, so hopefully I will be forgiven for this.

Many of you will be concerned about the lack of apparent progress with the installation of the Speed Indicator Devices. As I write these notes I am expecting an update from the Wiltshire engineering team who will be carrying out the first part of the installation process. This has been hampered by responsible officers enjoying their annual leave and the "spanner in the works" caused by one of the sites being located on the access point to the new housing development.

The change in location may well mean that another onsite meeting will need to be arranged. We are determined to "get this done" and will do our best to move things forward.

Whilst discussing traffic issues, we have submitted a request to Devizes LHFIG (Local Highway and Footway Improvement Group) to consider a number of suggestions to improve the situation which reflect ideas shared at various meetings over the last few months. These things inevitably seem slow to progress but we are constantly keeping the issue to the forefront in the best way we can. We are keeping an eye out for potential funding streams. The changes we would like to see are unlikely to be cheap and our financial resources are limited.

We are expecting to have a meeting with Tom Sheppard, who is representing Newland Homes, prior to our next Parish Council meeting. This will be an opportunity to get to know each other and to share concerns and ideas in a positive light. (continued from previous page)

We have already been able to clarify some of the detail, but I would prefer to share information more widely after we have had the chance to meet with the developers in person. The main concerns we have raised could be summarised as:-

Number of new homes in total

How many of those will be "affordable" homes?

What consultation is taking place with residents?

What provision will be made for improved recreation and other facilities?

What support could there be to alleviate traffic issues and access through the village?

It should be noted that the access point to the new estate, which has generally been felt to be unsuitable, has already been agreed as part of the planning process.

We are expecting Mr Sheppard, the Planning Director of Newland Homes to visit the village to meet local residents and listen to their concerns in the next few weeks. We are not expecting there to be a formal presentation. We will share details of timings and location when we can via social media, notice boards etc.

We have been contacted by a young man called Oliver Symes who made an offer to source and plant trees in the Sandleaze recreation area. Oliver attended our last meeting and shared his passion for trees with us. He proposed to order trees via the Woodland Trust (in a similar way to the ones we obtained linked to the Great War commemoration). We were pleased to support his idea in principle and will be having an on site meeting with him to iron out the details.

Most of you will have noticed the appearance, and rapid disappearance, of the "20 is plenty" stickers that were posted through the village. The vandalism that led to their removal was disappointing and surprising as it's hard to conceive why anyone would object to our village being made safer for us all. At the request of some residents who live on the High Street I reported the incident to the police. I can confirm that



there hasn't been sufficient evidence reported for the case to be pursued further. However, lessons have been learned and we will be reviewing the most effective way to encourage motorists to drive safely through our village. Whilst on the subject of safety, I feel the need to remind residents whose property borders footpaths and pavements to ensure safe passageway for pedestrians. If anyone finds this difficult, please let me know via <u>clerk@worton.org.uk</u>, and we will try to help via the village maintenance group.

Thanks once again to all of those who supported the improvements to the "Jubilee" footpath by contributing to the appeal led by ClIr Patricia Goodenough. I am pleased to be able to report that the target was reached and that we should be able to cover the ongoing maintenance of the Worton section of the path for the immediate future.

Lastly, a reminder that the next Parish Council meeting will be on October 3rd at the Village Hall. The start time may change from the scheduled 7.30pm if there is also a meeting with Mr Sheppard from Newland Homes on the same date.



Climate Stewards aim to help individuals and small and large organisations *measure* their carbon footprint, *reduce* what they can and *offset* the rest. They are passionate about helping us live better on low carbon while supporting our global neighbours to adapt to the impacts of climate change.

For example, individuals can use free of charge Climate Stewards' carbon footprint calculators to work out the carbon emissions from all areas of life – flights, driving, public transport, household energy, food, waste, water and everything else.

Their 360carbon calculator is designed to help churches, small charities and businesses work out their carbon footprint from everything they do. Carbon footprint audits and carbon neutral advice are available for large charities and medium to large businesses.

Once you know how big your carbon footprint is, you can pinpoint areas where you can cut down or eliminate it. Climate Stewards provide some really helpful suggestions about how to reduce your carbon emissions. Carbon offsetting is a way of compensating for the negative impact of our carbon emissions by paying to fund carbon mitigation projects. Climate Stewards guarantees that any money you pay will be used to remove an equivalent amount of CO₂ from the atmosphere. https://www.climatestewards.org/offset/

Its nine partner carbon offsetting projects in six countries are all rooted in their individual local communities, initiated and designed by local organisations to bring benefits to biodiversity, health, family income and the local environment, as well as carbon mitigation. include: biosand water filters for families in Uganda; community forestry planting in Ghana, Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda; safer, cleaner, fuel-efficient metal cookstoves for low-income families in Nepal and Peru; and time, water, fuel and money saving fireless cookers for families in Uganda.



A Message from Tamara Reay Wiltshire Councillor for The Devizes Rural West Division

A lifetime of service and duty

It could not have been more appropriate that the last public photograph of Queen Elizabeth II was taken two days before her death and was of her undertaking official duties. Indeed, she was performing perhaps her single most important duty: inviting a Prime Minister to form a government. Duty may be regarded as defining her reign. Outgoing and incoming Prime Ministers having to make round trips to Balmoral from Westminster in this second week of September 2022 was an indication both of continuity – Liz Truss is the Queen's fifteenth premier; the first was Winston Churchill – and change: in 1974 she flew from Australia to be in Buckingham Palace in time to receive the Prime Minister.

That it was always known this moment would come, has done little to diminish its impact for many of us. Along with Wiltshire Council colleagues, officers, and members of the public, I attended the Wiltshire Proclamation on the steps of old County Hall in Trowbridge on Sunday 11 September, and I was struck by the historical significance of the occasion. Following a minute's silence HM Lord-Lieutenant of Wiltshire, Mrs Sarah Rose Troughton introduced the event by saying, "This is a unique occasion. We are witnessing part of the fabric of our history dating back to the Middle Ages, to a time when this form of communication was the only official way that people heard such news." As I stood there my mind was taken on a kaleidoscopic journey through time, pre social media and 24-hour news, to the proclamations for Queen Elizabeth in 1952 and George VI in 1936, and earlier to the days when a stagecoach from London would have brought news of a new monarch to the people of Wiltshire.

Monarchs are accidental, are creations of circumstance, but some more than others. Initially she had no expectation of serving. One of the many remarkable aspects of the Queen's reign is that it came about, only because in 1936 her uncle, Edward VIII, declined to make the sacrifices required by his station, and abdicated. George VI passed the spirit of service to his daughter, and I am sure that October 2022

many of us will have reflected on the speech which the then Princess Elizabeth gave from Cape Town on her 21st birthday when she promised, "that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong".





RIGHTS OF WAY

There are always problems with rights of way. In 1949 Wiltshire County Council recorded all the paths in our area on a definitive map. This has now been up-dated and this month is shown across the middle pages of this magazine. The County Council now employs a rights of way officer for this area.

Public footpaths (usually a minimum of 1 metre wide) can only be used by walkers. Public bridleways (minimum 2 metres wide) can only be used by walkers, horse riders and cyclists (NOT motorised vehicles). By ways are open to motor vehicles as well as walkers, horse riders and cyclists.

Please let Parish Council or the County Council (the enforcement authority) know if a local footpath of the sort described above is being misused or abused or if there is no clear route shown or signposts are damaged or there are obstructions like barbed wire fences, ploughed up or with broken stiles or bridges.

For your information, if a path on the definitive map is, say, blocked by barbed wire you can legally remove enough of it to allow you to pass. Naturally, if a path is ploughed up the farmer is entitled to a reasonable time to make the route clear again - a day is usual and up to 14 days if the path disturbance is the first time a particular crop is planted there. Is is no longer acceptable that a right of way running along the edge of a field should be ploughed up.

You can still go through the field if the line of the path is not clear, but make sure you keep as near as possible to where you think the line is and ensure you do the minimum damage to the crops. You are not entitled to let your dog run free over a farmer's field, with or without crops, only on the footpath.

If you come across a bull in a field you want to cross it might be as well to find an alternative route. A farmer is entitled to allow a bull in a field where there is a right of way as long as it is a non-dairy breed and is accompanied by cows or if it is less than 10 months old.

Please contact the Clerk to Worton Parish Council if you can help, with footpath number 10. Details elsewhere in this magazine.
