## **Pastoral Letter**

Curates come and Curates go. And sadly that is what is happening to this curate (curate = trainee vicar). This edition of the Parish Magazine seems like a good opportunity then to reflect on the past two years before I bow out in October.

As civil rights activist Maya Angelou famously said "People will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel."

Well, you made me feel welcomed and supported and you have shown me real patience as I found my way around various aspects of 'the job'. For that I will always remember you and want to take the opportunity to say thank you.

Over the past two years we have lived through that pandemic that shall not be named and we've had more than our fair share of illness and loss across our team. In my first letter that I wrote when I started, I said that I was interested to see what the mystical source of all love (aka God) was up to in the area and seeing how I can join in. Well, there's been loads of things! We have set up our new group 'Quest' that meets every Saturday at 5:15pm to discuss matters of life and faith in a safe, informal and fun setting. Find out more here <u>https://www.quest4faith.org</u> and Messy Church, for younger people, is going great guns. We had a crazy soaking wet Harvest Festival, enjoyed Easter around a firepit, have been doing a lot more with our schools and have hosted Bishops from South Africa and South Sudan. All things that I could not have predicted, yet they did and it all turned out to be a lot of fun.

The single most important thing I've learned over the past two years is that whether people come to church on a Sunday or not, whether someone says they have a faith or not, whether a person used to be religious and now doesn't feel they are; that people are (in the main) kind, decent and caring towards one another. We only need to look to the community support schemes to see that in action. I personally can't believe that this loving attitude towards others, including strangers, is the product of some random set of helium molecules lining up in an improbably lucky way (like 1 chance in 10 with 70 zeros after it). I remain convinced that there is a source to that love, a thing that I call God,

or a divine fountain if you like, that keeps on pouring out love in the midst of situations where love is often most absent (our response to Ukrainian refugees is but one example). So, whatever your relationship with religion or faith (they are not the same things by the way), keep tapping into the source of love through quiet time, meditation or prayer and, until we meet again, keep on doing all the amazing good that you are doing!

## **ECO-CORNER**

## Proposed changes in the law will help reduce plastic in our oceans

An estimated 11 billion wet wipes are disposed of in this country each year and during the pandemic the number being used increased significantly. Many of these wipes are described as "flushable" because they are biodegradable, but it can take up to 100 years for a wet wipe to degrade. When wet wipes are flushed away, they can end up congealed with fat in the sewers or end up on our beaches.

In November 2021, the river charity, Thames21, released data showing that a mound of wet wipes, the size of two tennis courts and over a metre tall, had grown at the side of the river over the last 6 years. <u>https://www.ecomagazine.com/news/coasts/laser-scans-showdevastating-impact-of-wet-wipes-on-the-thames</u>

The marine Conservation Trust reported that wet wipes are one of the most common litter items found on UK beaches; last year in their Great British Beach Clean they discovered 18 wet wipes for every 100 metres of beach. <u>https://www.mcsuk.org/what-you-can-do/join-a</u>-beach-clean/source-to-sea-litter-quest/

90% of wet wipes contain plastic such as polyester, polyethylene and polypropylene. These plastics break down into microplastics which are small enough to be ingested by marine life, affecting their development and entering the food chain.

For many people, particularly parents of young children, wet wipes are an important part of the toolkit. However, wet wipes don't need to contain plastic to be effective and Fleur Anderson, MP and mother of 4, has introduced a Private Members Bill to prohibit the manufacture and sale of wet wipes containing plastic. This Bill, which has support from across the House, is due to have its second reading on 16<sup>th</sup> September.

Some manufacturers have already made changes to their own brand products to make them plastic free and some stores are offering sustainable alternatives

What can you do to help?

- If you don't need to, don't use wipes!
- If you need to use wipes, make sure they are plastic free and don't flush them unless they meet the "Fine to Flush" specification.
- Contact your MP and ask for their support with the second reading of the Plastic Bill on 16<sup>th</sup> September: <u>https://</u> parallelparliament.co.uk/bills/2022-23/plasticswetwipes

### Autumn Vaccinations at Courtyard Surgery

### **COVID Vaccinations**

Courtyard Surgery will be vaccinating at the Surgery in West Lavington on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Start dates will depend on Vaccine deliveries. We have ordered 1470 vaccines to arrive in the first week of September. Eligible patients will be contacted as soon as there are firm dates. We do not expect to be vaccinating under 13s. Appointments can be booked elsewhere through the national system.

### **Flu Vaccinations**

As with the COVID vaccinations there will be clinics on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Eligible patients visiting the surgery for other reasons may be offered vaccination whilst they are there. Patients who are also eligible for Pneumococcal vaccination will be offered that vaccination with their flu vaccine.

### If coming to a clinic

Please ensure you wear a face mask at all times whilst inside the building. Alcohol gel will be available for your use.


Please arrive at your appointment time. If you are more than 10 minutes late you will get a reminder phone call.

Too ensure social distancing, access to the waiting area will be controlled. Whilst waiting, you should remove coats and jumperrs and roll up your sleeve. All clinical staff will be wearing full PPE and there will be minimal contact with the

### patient.

Once you have received your flu vaccination, you will be asked to immediately leave the building via a separate exit.

The Churchill Car Park will only be open while the pub is open, and is for their customers. If you use their car park please pop in for a coffee.

### A Message from Tamara Reay Wiltshire Councillor for The Devizes Rural West Division Help with the Cost of Living

Whilst thankfully fuel prices at the petrol pumps have reduced slightly over the last few weeks, I know that concerns about the cost of living, especially as winter approaches, are high on many residents' agendas. By the time you read this, we should know who our next Prime Minister will be. The two candidates have been advocating slightly different approaches to dealing with inflation, whilst driving economic growth. I am assured by both that further measures to mitigate energy costs will be announced - especially for those for whom energy costs make up a large part of their monthly expenditure.

Meanwhile I am pleased that Wiltshire Council has been getting on with distributing the £150 Government energy rebate on council tax bills for households in bands A-D. 140,000 eligible households in Wiltshire have now received their rebate and the council is now working on a further discretionary fund for people on low incomes who live in properties banded E-H. Anyone who has any queries about these rebates should call the revenues team at Wiltshire Council on 0300 456 0109.

Over the next few months many of us should benefit from further assistance with all households receiving  $\pounds 400$  off energy bills starting in October. The  $\pounds 400$  (non-repayable) discounts, administered by energy suppliers, will be paid to consumers over 6 months with payments starting from October 2022, to ensure households receive financial support throughout the winter months.

Of course, the background to the global increase in energy costs is complex, and there is much more for the government to do to deal with these supplyside challenges, and some tough decisions will need to be made by our new Prime Minister on energy strategy. As Wiltshire Council Portfolio Holder for Climate Change (and given that almost all households across Devizes Rural West are off the gas-grid) I am pleased that there was very strong interest in the Solar Together scheme and I am looking forward to more households taking up this offer.

Clearly, reducing energy usage is key and as we prepare for Autumn, I also wanted to highlight Warm and Safe Wiltshire which is a commitment from Wiltshire Council and Dorset and Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service to help residents live in safer and healthier homes. The energy advice line can provide support with the installation of draught-proofing measures, smoke alarms to improve fire safety and providing advice on reducing energy use, switching energy suppliers, reducing condensation and damp problems, and controlling heating. There are Government schemes to further reduce the



### You cost people their jobs!

Standing at the side of the road during our speedwatch sessions we are accustomed to verbal and digital abuse from passing motorists. We also get 'the children' who think revving the engine or slowing to a walking pace as they pass is clever.

The driver of a white van recently displayed his displeasure at our presence by lowering his trousers and mooning us. Quite a feat for a chap his size whilst the vehicle was still in motion.

Occasionally we get 'you cost people their jobs' shouted at us. We have a letter from Wiltshire Police to be handed to anyone who approaches us in the course of our sessions.

In this letter it states:

"Community Speedwatch monitors the speed of vehicles through local communities.

Community Speedwatch does not enforce the law, but those identified as exceeding the speed limit can expect to receive an advisory letter from the police.

Community Speedwatch is designed to support the police by making us all aware of the dangers of travelling too fast for the prevailing conditions."

### Education not prosecution!

Several people, myself included, have had their arm brushed by the wing mirror of a passing vehicle whilst walking down the narrow pavements of the High Street. For a young mother with a child in a pushchair and another walking at her side going down to the Village School on a dark winter morning it can be quite frightening.

For the small minority of residents in the village who give us abuse try walking down the High Street and see for yourself the hazards involved.

On the plus side many passing motorists understand why we are there and show their appreciation. Some even requesting if we could go to their village.

Whilst there is no actual Parish Council meeting to report back on (August has traditionally seen us in a Parish version of Parliamentary recess!), there are significant developments on a couple of important and, as it transpires, related topics which need to be reported. We have been contacted by Newlands Homes who are the developers now responsible for the Sandleaze Farm site. The Parish Council will be meeting with their representative, probably in October, and a village meeting will be arranged, also probably in October, where information will be given and questions answered. We will share more detail when we have it.

Your Council believes that we have reached a stage where positive dialogue between ourselves (Council and residents) and the developers is important to try to get as positive an outcome as possible from a development which will undoubtedly have considerable short and long term impacts.

It is standard practice that resources are made available as part of the process where housing development takes place -many of you will be aware of local examples where new facilities have been provided which have benefited the whole community. We do not yet know exactly what could be available and how it could be used. Nor do we know how much influence we can have on your behalf.

We do, however, have the responses that have been shared with regard to our Village plan, which reflect those that have generally been expressed in the time we have lived in Worton. We will share these with the developers and emphasise their importance, namely traffic speed and volume, safe access for pedestrians through the length of the village and recreation facilities. In the meantime, I recommend a look at the developer's website, <u>https://www.newlandhomes.co.uk</u> where detail about the plans for the Worton site can be seen within the "news" section.

I have recently become aware of some confusion about what the difference is between a "neighbourhood" plan and a "village" plan. Neighbourhood planning gives communities more control over the future of their area by giving local people the chance to have their say on what happens where they live. One of the ways of doing this is by producing a Neighbourhood Plan. Worton has had a Neighbourhood

Planning group which is currently in abeyance whilst the overall planning picture becomes clearer. More information available on the WVC website: <u>https://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/planning-neighbourhood-what</u>


