



Worton Community Speedwatch - May 2023

(Wiltshire Speedwatch sessions are restricted to 45 minutes)

Sessions: EIGHT

Total Vehicles Counted: 4,101

Vehicles recorded for exceeding the 30mph speed limit: <u>186</u> of which <u>45</u> were reported to Wiltshire Police for excess speed.

Maximum Speed Recorded: <u>49mph</u> on Tuesday 16th May between 07.15 and 08.00.

Highest vehicle count <u>630</u> on Tuesday 16th May between 16.45 and 17.30.

(The comparable figures for **May 2022** were: Sessions **13**, Vehicles **5,067** with **300** vehicles exceeding 30mph of which **63** were reported for excess speed.)

On Tuesday 30th May Officers from the Police Road Unit Speed Enforcement Team were again present in Worton, located opposite Sandleaze. The officers reported that their presence visibly slowed the traffic and no vehicles were reported for exceeding the speed limit.

Worton Parish Council

Parish Councillors have continued to focus on the issues raised at the annual parish meeting. We are beginning to give serious thought to what difference the expected "windfall" we are anticipating from the Sandleaze Housing development can make. At the time of writing, we are still awaiting confirmation of approval from Wiltshire planning (the latest "deadline" has passed). Whilst broadly supportive of the latest version of the application. we did support concerns that had been expressed about details to the proposed drainage arrangements. We are also pleased that changes have been made that clearly responded to suggestions about the location of different types of property (from residents and councillors). As a body, your Parish Council intends to work as closely as possible with the developers to ensure that the development will enhance the facilities for residents new and old.

With that in mind, we are shifting our focus on improving access through the village to Back Lane and the associated footpath. We are aware that residents have expressed concern about the practicality of using the footpath, particularly for those using mobility aids and pushchairs. We have previously explored the possibilities of connecting the existing path with new facilities in the development. We would like to see an enhanced route that can be used comfortably providing a practical alternative to the pedestrian footway along the main road.

Of course, this is easier said than done and would require cooperation from a range of interested parties. The rural character would need to be maintained and the rights of existing landowners respected. We need to be patient on this but have agreed to explore the possibilities with Devizes LHFIG (Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group) which has provided significant financial support for previous endeavours such as SID installation. It would be likely that we would concentrate our efforts on this site rather than improving pedestrian access along the main road.

Talking of SIDS, we are grateful to Bob and his team for his regular updates in this magazine. They have clearly made a difference, and it's interesting to compare the impacts they make depending on location and orientation. Sadly, no matter what precautions are put in place, accidents will happen. Hopefully no serious injury resulted from the recent collision with the village gate and planter. The repair process has been initiated but may take some time. However, we have supported the proposal to move the planters to a safer location in the village.

Cllr Powell's maintenance group continues to be in demand. They will be focussing on making the footpaths more accessible, including Mill Race. May I once again seek cooperation from residents on maintaining their vegetation and considering joining Malcolm in his endeavours?

Talking of support, I am relieved to hear (on the grapevine) that there are positive signs in relation to the Village Hall - I may still have the opportunity to bamboozle residents with my unique take on Bingo in a forthcoming event. I, and many others, were overwhelmed by the event organised by friends of our muchmissed Rosemary, particularly fellow WI members and the current Village Hall team. A very large sum was raised in support of Dorothy House and a range of residents were involved in one way or another to show that the oft repeated mantra that "it's always just the same few who do", simply isn't the case for our two villages. It's not the few, it's the many!

I must also mention the efforts of Cllr Patricia again...Our Jubilee Walkway has been highlighted as a notable achievement at the Devizes Area Board - indeed, she has managed to source a third plaque, the location of which is yet to be determined.

Finally, we still have a place available on the Council for anyone who would like to offer their support. Please contact me, any of the other councillors, or Jules, our clerk, if you would like to find out more.

I'm sure you will all have noticed that a car managed to plough through one of the white gates and destroy the lovely new planter as well as the gate. Amazingly, the pots and plants survived unscathed and have been re-sited at the Village Hall. Much less tricky to water now.

Walking through the little uncut field behind the school I am encouraged to see lots of different wild flowers and grasses. Anyone who is less familiar with wild flower names might like a good App for their phone. I use Seek by iNaturalist when I find something unusual. It is really excellent on native flowers, grasses and insects. It only failed when it identified Alfie, our terrier, as a Domestic Sheep!! Perhaps mammals are not its forte. I am pondering a round on wild flower id for the next guiz – would that be good? A friend told me that on a recent course she is doing to become a walking group leader, none of the other 5 adults in her group could identify an oak or rowan tree, never mind any of the wild flowers! I wonder if the increase in interest in programmes such as Springwatch, along with the encouragement of rewilding projects and the current environmental issues, will generate a desire for increased knowledge of flora and fauna.

We had a very informative talk in May on how to prepare entries for the Village Show so, no excuses now. We are hoping to have lots of entries this year and you will find the schedule and entry form enclosed in this edition. Open to all residents in the villages.

Exhibits must not be removed before the close of the show. Red dots will be available from the committee for exibitors to identify those exhibits they wish to remove at the end of the show.

The committee's decision shall be final in all matters except the allocation of prizes which shall be left to the discretion of the judges whose decision shall also be final.

Exhibitors will be restricted to one entry per class.

Points will be awarded in each class on the basis of three for 'FIRST', two for 'SECOND' and one for 'THIRD'. The Club Champion will be determined by adding the points awarded from the Vegetable, Flower, Fruit and Biggest sections. The Show Champion will be determined by adding the points awarded from the Vegetable, Flower, Fruit and Home Produce sections.

In the event of a tie on points gained in each class, the final positions will be decided on the basis of the number of first places, and if equal on the number of first places, the final positions will be decided on the number of second places.



Worton and Marston Village Show 2023 - Guidance notes

To all potential entrants to the show, the schedule contains basic information for each class in the show. Where classes are marked with an asterisk, you will find further helpful guidance in these notes.

Whilst we hope that our show attracts gardeners, cooks and crafters, young and old, we want everyone to feel they can take part so please give it a go.

Vegetable section

The general idea is that in most of the classes, the items displayed should be similar in size and shape but please do not dig up a whole row of carrots to find three identical. Vegetables should be clean but not polished. Onions should have a layer of brown skin. Beetroot should be no larger than a tennis ball. If your beans are not quite straight, wrap them carefully in a damp tea towel for a few hours.

Flower section

Classes 18 and 19. You can remove one or two of the bottom blooms off the stem of the gladioli if they have gone over a little.

Classes 20, 21, 22. In each class, three blooms of the same variety is ideal but not essential. Decorative dahlias refer to the large dinner plate style, with blooms 6" or larger.

Please note if the class identifies blooms or stems, blooms are single, stems can have multiple blooms.

Class 32, the flower arrangement, max. 25cm width, 25cm depth, unlimited height. This will be judged from the front on artistic merit. Any plant material may be used – fresh or dried. Accessories and titles allowed. Fresh plant material must be in water. Plant material must predominate.

Home produce section

Paper plates will be available for display.

Entries in all classes except 59 will be tasted by the judges. As well as taste, produce will be judged on appearance, colour, texture and bake.

In those classes with four slices, they should be of similar size and appearance (classes 52,54,58)

Advice for sealing jams and chutneys.

Lids of any jars should NOT be re-used. The best alternative is the traditional use of a wax disc, placed when the jam is warm and a cellophane top stretched over and attached with an elastic band. New jar tops or clean plastic snap on lids can be used.

In all jam and chutney classes, the jar should have details of the product inside and when made.

The biggest section

This too should be self explanatory. By nature a number of the exhibits will be knobbly and ugly, please can they be washed as much as possible.

Class 76 The Geranium exhibit. The Gardening Club members were all given a small geranium plant in May and encouraged to take it home, feed it, lavish love, pot it on several times until it has grown to a beautiful, healthy looking, floriferous creature ready for the show.

Class 77 A mixed planter up to 18" in diameter containing up to 6 plant varieties.





Energy Efficiency in our Homes

Wiltshire Council is working to improve the energy efficiency of homes across the County and at the heart of this is the Local Plan which sets out the vision for the future of Wiltshire and a framework for addressing housing needs and other economic, social and environmental priorities. The revised Local Plan will be considered by Cabinet and Council in July, before a public Consultation takes place later this year and I'm pleased that sustainability is at the heart of the proposals.

Meanwhile there is a good deal of progress in a number of other housing projects which will be the forerunner for more improvements.

- The Council is committed to building 1000 Affordable Homes over the next decade and in Semington, the council has worked with developers, Newland Homes, to build six zero-carbon affordable rent and shared ownership homes - they use the latest zero carbon technology, in a rural location with no access to mains gas.
- A planning application has been submitted for 33 affordable houses at Lower Park Farm, Caen Hill, Devizes. The proposed houses would be built using the modern methods of construction process the houses would be highly insulated and fitted with heat pumps and those with a south-facing aspect would also have solar panels. The planning application is available to view via the council's planning web pages the planning application number is PL/2023/00615
- More than £3.6m of Government funding has been secured which will increase the energy efficiency and reduce the carbon footprint of up to 210 Council homes in the county the funding is part of the Government's Home Upgrade Grant Phase 2.
- Housing associations Aster and Selwood were successful in a bid for Social Housing Decarbonisation. The Aster project is for a total of £1m with more than £0.5m in grant funding. Selwood was awarded £1.4m alongside £4.3m co-funding from Selwood Housing, to deliver 'fabric first' improvements to more than 150 homes in Wiltshire.

The Council has also launched phase two of the Solar Together scheme which offers cost-effective solar panel and battery storage installation for residents and businesses. Since the first round of the scheme launched in May 2022, over 1,500 homeowners across Wilt-

shire and Swindon have so far installed over 8,500 solar panels and 720 storage batteries to benefit from generating their own renewable energy. It's appreciated that the prospect of choosing an installer and making the change to renewable energy can be quite daunting, but Solar Together makes the switch to clean energy as hassle-free as possible.

The scheme is now open, and the deadline is 11 August 2023. People who are interested can register for free, and, following a competitive bidding process managed by Solar Together, will then be sent their recommended provider and costs, with no obligation to proceed with the installation. More information is at: Solar Together | Wiltshire Council
