Pastoral Letter

Maureen's Ramblings

I love reading. I will need to live until I am 150 to read all the books on my shelves and Kindle! And my TBR pile gets bigger and bigger because I can't stop adding to it! I particularly enjoy getting so engrossed in a novel that I forget to get up/go to sleep/ work/do anything else – because I need to know the ending! But how incredibly disappointing when the ending is not what I wanted. Seriously?! Where's the justice?! Where's the happily ever after?! I hate it when things end without a good and reasoned conclusion.

But isn't this true to life? Unanticipated, sudden and unpredictable endings can be so intensely frustrating and difficult. In life there are no rewrites; the story is over when the story is over and we probably won't get to decide how it ends.

It is two years ago this month that my dear friend Anne died. This ending wasn't what we had planned, expected or wanted. Anyone who has experienced a loss of any kind, through death, divorce, loss of health, unemployment or infertility, etc already knows the "this is not how it was supposed to end" feeling.

After a loss we face many challenges. We step into new roles; we face unprepared-for changes; we reorder our lives and expectations. We hope above all that, along the way, we'll find strength, joy, purpose and happiness again and that, on most days, we'll like the person we've become. It's hard work – adjusting, reframing, and rethinking our lives – but finding balance and a new sense of self is possible.

The church begins its journey through Lent on Ash Wednesday this month (22nd). The word "Lencten" means "Spring!" It is a time of "new" beginnings in our faith, and a renewed joy of God walking alongside us. It's like the ancipated excitement of beginning a new book; it's the child-like delight at the prospect of new life re-emerging from the cold earth; the tedious greyness of winter gently being shouldered aside by the beautiful blossom on the trees and the bright colours of the emerging crocus. The evenings get longer and the sky seems to be filled with bird song. In the face of unexpected endings there is something about the spring that

makes me feel optimistic about life and lifts my heart from the spiritual winter I have been living through.

Spring excites us because it is so full of promise. It whispers that, tho' summer has not yet arrived, winter, and the grey, cold, sadness of loss is passing. The random green shoots prepare us for the tide of green to come; the apple blossom tells us to get ready for the off; the bird song reminds us of the long warm evenings to come and of new life. Lent is a beginning that, like the best books, is full of promise. We don't know how the next ending will be, but we will keep on living (and reading) with hope.

Today, January 14th, I have picked a few of the glorious Hellebores just coming into flower in my garden. You only need 5 for a lovely display. Nip the flowers off close to the top of the stem and float them in a saucer of water to truly appreciate each one with different markings and colours. If you feel there's not enough winter interest in your garden from evergreen shrubs, grasses or early flowers then our Garden Club talk on Monday February 20th is all about planting borders for year-round interest. All are welcome.

Commemorative Tree - We have bought a beautiful Crab Apple tree, Malus Rosehip, to be planted near the bench alongside the path leading from Worton to Marston. 

ECO-CORNER

Plastics are again on the Eco-agenda

In January 2021, we wrote: "The fact that plastics are now a serious concern for the planet is evidenced by the fact that more and more governments are proposing measures to reduce their impact. Environmental pollution is one reason; it can take up to between 500 and 1,000 years for plastics to decompose in landfills and the chemicals that go into plastics during the manufacturing process can potentially leach out into our food, water and bodies. Another reason is that the manufacturing of plastic products affects the environment through carbon emissions and other types of airborne pollution contributing to global warming. Researchers worry particularly about the effects on children and what continued accumulation means for future generations."

In January 2023, plastics are back on the agenda. Having already banned the sale of plastic straws, stirrers and cotton buds in England in its fight against single use plastic waste, the Government is now expected to announce the phasing out of the use of single-use plastic cutlery, plates and polystyrene cups, to be replaced by biodegradable alternatives. It is also thought to be looking at wet wipes and tobacco filters among other single-use plastics.

A spokesperson for The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) said:" We are determined to go further and faster to reduce, reuse and recycle more of our resources in order to transform our waste industry and deliver on our commitments in the ambitious 25-year environment plan."

Environmental groups have welcomed this initiative and, as we've said in the past, each of us can choose not to use products containing plastic and purchase sustainable alternatives instead. As consumers, we can also look to make manufacturers change the way they produce by changing the way we consume.

Hoping that our 2023 will be as plastics-free as possible!

Worton Parish Council

Tom Sheppard, representing Newland Homes attended our January meeting in order to clarify things and answer questions ahead of the deadline for comments on the Sandleaze Housing Development which is moving to the latest stage of planning consultation process.

I am pleased to report that, as we have become accustomed, discussion was amicable and constructive. Your Parish Council has made no objections, but we have made a number of comments following forensic examination of a huge range of data and detail. These were all intended to produce the best result for all concerned but with the interests of the whole community at their heart. Largely these points relate to fine details and included potential drainage issues, parking provision etc.

An important issue for us is the detail of how the process of allocation of affordable housing will be managed. We are determined that the village residents and their families will have priority in the process, with the Parish Council having a central role. This has been the intention expressed by the parties involved but we are determined to hold them to their word!

It should be noted that, even though we understand the ongoing concerns about the access issues linked to the new development, the planning process has moved beyond that and raising the issue again would be fruitless. We are rather disposed to work as closely with Newland as we can in order to gain the maximum benefits that we can secure for the whole village community. Signs continue to be positive in this respect.

An update on SIDS (Speed Indicator Devices). One set should be up and running by the time you read this. The main reason for delay has been testing out the software and determining the best way to deploy and use the devices. Once we have tested out a device in practice, the second one will be put into action as well. Their location will move within the village periodically. The SIDS will be operated by the Parish

Council and Speedwatch team working together.

I have previously shared ideas which have been considered with regard to improving the traffic concerns that have been raised consistently by residents. Obviously any proposal will raise issues of practicability and funding implications. At this stage we are simply sharing ideas which we can present to the Devizes LHFIG (Local Highway and Footway Improvement Groups) who represent the most likely source of practical and financial support. They and their predecessor, CATG (Community Area Transport Group), have supported us with the SIDS project and change of speed limit. At this stage, specific details have not been entered into but we are well aware that issues and concerns will arise. However, it's important to get our ideas on the table as support is obviously limited and can take considerable time to come to fruition.

I have become aware of concerns about car parking and access in Sandleaze. We have every sympathy and have done our best to share and support residents' concerns. However, it's important to recognise that the Parish Council has very limited power in many situations and, whilst we will always listen and advise as best we can, there may be very little we can actually do to fix the problem. Please remember that the MyWiltshire portal https://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/mywilts-online-reporting is there for individual residents to use to raise concerns and is likely to be the most effective way to "get things done" more speedily.

Unfortunately, there appears to have been a spate of burglaries in recent weeks, especially in outbuildings. Hopefully this trend has died down for the time being, but as Shaw Taylor used to say "Keep 'em peeled"!

Finally, again, I'm making an appeal for someone to take on the role of clerk. The hours are generally flexible and easy to fit into other routines and responsibilities. It's a chance to get to see how proper local government works and would be an excellent way to build a CV for anyone interested in a career

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

The council's current household waste management strategy follows the waste hierarchy, aiming to **reduce**, **reuse and recycle** as much as possible, while dealing with residual waste in the most sustainable way currently available. The council has two landfill diversion contracts in place to help manage its residual waste and very little, if any, Wiltshire household residual waste is sent to landfill, and so any food waste present is used to contribute to the generation of energy or processing into a fuel.

You may have seen in other local authorities and indeed overseas, weekly or bi-weekly doorstep food waste collections. Wiltshire Council's current waste strategy is to not provide a separate collection of food waste as the provision of such a system would be prohibitively expensive to implement and operate across the large rural county. The current strategy prioritises working with residents to reduce the amount of food that they waste in the first instance, helping families to not waste money, and by continuing to offer subsidised home food waste digesters. Wiltshire Council has teamed up with Great Green Systems to offer Wiltshire residents discounted food waste composters, called a Green Johanna. These "hot composters" are available for only £60 (discounted from £129.99). More information is online at Reducing your waste and composting - Wiltshire Council

However, the Government has consulted widely on proposed policy which would mandate consistency in household and business recycling collections in England. This is expected to include the mandatory introduction of weekly food waste collections by 2025.

All of the council's kerbside collected recyclables are managed by Hills at a Materials Recycling Facility at Sands farm, Calne. The council benefits from a 79% share of the income generated from the sale of materials collected through the kerbside recycling service. During the six months April to Sept '22, this realised £2.24m in income, as recycling commodity prices were particularly strong during the first part of the year. However, increasing levels of contamination can result in downgraded prices paid, or material being rejected. Residents can help improve recycling rates, and ultimately reduce the cost of managing waste to the council taxpayer by ensuring that:

• Only recyclables are put into blue bins – sadly all too often bags of general waste and nappies find their way into the blue bins;

- Flexible or soft plastics, such as bread bags, packaging film and carrier bags cannot be recycled through the blue-bin scheme people should place these in their residual waste bins where the waste is used to generate energy, or alternatively take to a local supermarket if they have facilities to collect them for recycling;
- Packing materials in cardboard boxes (such as polystyrene). This can't be recycled so we recommend that non-card packing materials are put into the residual waste
- Wrapping paper only paper wrapping paper can be recycled. To check if wrapping paper is made of paper, people can use the "scrunch test". Scrunch the paper and if it stays in a ball, it can be recycled in your blue-lidded bin;
- Scrap metals large biscuit tins can be recycled, but large car parts cannot!

Wiltshire Council has recently introduced a kerbside battery collection service. People can now leave most small household batteries for recycling (as long as they are not leaking) including D, C, AA, AAA, 9V and button-type batteries and these should be placed on top of blue-lidded bins in a sealed, transparent plastic bag ready for collection. Every year hundreds of fires at waste facilities across the country are linked to batteries thrown out in the bin. People can help to prevent fires and keep staff safe by only disposing of batteries using the new kerbside collection service or at battery collection points at locations such as supermarkets.

Finally, I would like to thank residents across Devizes Rural West for everything you do to reduce the impact on the environment and the cost of managing waste to Council Taxpayers. More detailed information is online at Rubbish and recycling - Wiltshire Council

NEW SEASON BEGINS ON MARCH 18TH

The new season of Edington Arts concerts begins on **Saturday 18th March** with an afternoon of music from the young and extremely talented international De Beauvoir Trio.

The trio was formed in 2019 by violinist Enyuan Khong, with cellist Charlotte Kaslin and pianist Elisabeth Pion; they were recommended to us by the international music charity IMS-Prussia Cove, with whom we have had links for several years now. They were selected for the IMS masterclasses in April 2022, cementing their reputation as one of the most talented and exciting ensembles of their generation.


