

Pastoral Letter

Maureen's Ramblings.....

What has the Church of England ever done for me? asked The Telegraph a while back. Of course, the church has its struggles and there is a decrease in people seeking God through organised religion. But in the 2021 Census "Christian" remained the most common response to the religion question. 85% of people apparently visit a church each year - to see beautiful, historic buildings, to worship or to mark a significant event in their lives. When a child goes missing, or floods destroy, it is often the parish church that provides a rallying point. In 2021 605,000 people went to church each week in the UK – making Christianity the largest group activity in the country. Even in these secular days, the church is still the warp and weft of our national life with faith in Jesus Christ deep in the soil of our history (as shown in the recent Coronation).

Sadly, Church weddings and funerals are not as popular as they were even tho' the venues, time freedom and the care from the clergy are good and the costs reasonable. I am aware that many people seem to think that the church will not baptise their children or marry or bury them if they are not churchgoers. This is not true – all are welcome for these important rites of passage. You just need to ask! William Temple said, "the Church is the only society on earth that exists for the benefit of non-members." Yes!

The church is here for everyone, whatever their faith or none. Clergy and church buildings are available for the whole community, not just for those who attend church regularly. I have so many stories of the church, mostly without fanfare, seeking to serve and minister where there is need. Sadly, resources don't allow for there to be a priest in every parish. But much of the work is done by faithful, hardworking volunteers who, amazingly, give about 23 million hours every month to work that benefits their local community - youth/children's work, street patrols, bereavement counselling, visiting the elderly, sick and housebound, lunch clubs, etc. Of course, many atheists and agnostics work just as hard, but nobody else has the same national network, or the historic connections with their communities.

You might not go to church, but please be assured that the church is here for you anyway. You don't have to sign up as a member to use the church to celebrate the birth of your child, marry, renew your vows or have a funeral or memorial service for a loved one who has died. You don't have to be a member to discuss what you believe or don't believe or to rant or rave about God. The church exists to serve. The church is here for you. You just need to ask!



The following has been brought to our attention and we felt it was important to share with you all. We have been made aware of an increase in thefts of GPS systems from agricultural vehicles in neighbouring counties over the past two weeks. Four units have been stolen in this time so we are encouraging Wiltshire farmers and agricultural contractors to be on the alert and keep their GPS systems safe.

The NFU advises:

- Activate PIN security on GPS kit with your own unique number if available
- If your system is not pin enabled, mark with your postcode to deter thieves and trace your property back to you
- Keep tractors and combines with GPS fitted stored out of sight when possible
- Remove GPS kit when possible from tractors and other machinery and store it securely when not in use
- Record serial numbers and photograph your kit
- Check serial numbers of second-hand kit offered for sale
- Report sightings of suspicious activity in fields and farmyards to police.

Other options could include fitting a tracker to GPS equipment and/or marking it with a DNA marking system such as that produced by SelectaDNA. You can learn more about this on the Force website following our launch of Op Siege last Year.

Worton Community Speedwatch – April 2023

(Wiltshire Speedwatch sessions are restricted to 45 minutes)

Sessions: NINE

Total Vehicles Counted: 3,253

Vehicles recorded for exceeding the 30mph speed limit: 186 of which **29** were reported to Wiltshire Police for excess speed.

Maximum Speed Recorded: 45mph on Wednesday 26th April between 13.15 and 16.15 and also Friday 28th April between 15.30 and 16.15.

Highest Vehicle Count: 467 on Friday 28th April between 15.30 and 16.15.

(The comparable figures for April 2022 were: Sessions 18, Vehicles 6.577 with 429 vehicles exceeding 30mph of which 84 were reported for excess speed).

On Wednesday 26th April our lunchtime Speedwatch team operating at Sandleaze were visited by two officers from the Police Road Unit Speed Enforcement Team. Prior to joining them they monitored the traffic at Cedar Close and recorded one vehicle travelling at 39mph. The vehicle owner will be contacted by the police.




SO - WHAT TO DO?


VILLAGE HALL NEWS AND A PLEA!!

And so, it is with regret that I have to report that, for the time being, this will be the last event that Trustees arrange. You will know that during the last year I have been asking for volunteers to become Trustees. The group has become beset with illness, and work and caring responsibilities and at our AGM in early May two Trustees stood down. In addition Jeff and I have taken the difficult decision to move and we currently have our house on the market. Although we have agreed to continue as Trustees for the time being, when we leave, the group will be unworkable. At present we do not know what this means for the Hall and I have asked advice from Wiltshire Village Halls Association. In addition, it will also have a bearing on the Hall's registration as a charity with the Charities Commission and therefore on our ability to apply for grant funding and possibly to operate. In short, we are in a perilous position because if we do not have a functioning Trustee group then the Hall is likely to have to close. Obviously remaining Trustees are doing our best to ensure this doesn't happen in the short term and that, at the very least, the hall remains open for regular users but my plea is, please consider volunteering as a Trustee. It is not onerous. The role is to provide and maintain the hall for the use of residents of Worton and Marston. At present we meet roughly every two months although the only mandatory meetings are our AGM in April/May and our Management Meeting in November. As a group we have enjoyed putting on events for villagers but a new group may decide not to do this or to put on different events. If you think you can help in this way please contact me on 01380 726845 or 07593 832481 or veronica.franklin@btinternet.com. I would be happy to meet with vou to discuss the role further. Please give this serious consideration.



Worton Parish Council

The Annual Parish meeting took place on May 15th. The venue was unusual but convivial, with Jackie and John allowing access to the Skittle Alley (many thanks to them). It had proved challenging to find a suitable alternative venue given the time frame in which we were working.

In all honesty, the attendance was somewhat disappointing. The relatively early start time may have been an issue (pointed out by one of the attendees), or maybe the village population is so happy and content that they don't feel the need to raise concerns with the Council?

On the other hand, this may reflect an apathy that would be of concern if it was spreading to other parts of village life. With this in mind, it was disappointing to hear Veronica Franklin's report from the Village Hall trustees. In simple terms, unless more residents step forward to act as trustees the Village Hall will cease to function. Veronica made clear that this is not an arduous role but is of great importance. She stressed that, unless things change, the regular events held to support the village hall will cease. Recently these have included the Coronation Tea, Christmas bazaar, Bingo etc. etc. - not to mention other social events that have become part of the flavour of our life in Worton, as well as raising vital money. Ironically, the fund raising to improve the village hall is reportedly on track to reach its target, meaning we could have the chance of a greatly improved facility lost.

So why the reluctance to come forward? The obvious issues are time, family commitments and a very busy lifestyle - we aren't all approaching our dotage! I also think it's easy to assume that everything's ok so there's no need to get involved or that any attempt to put oneself forward could be resented by those currently "in charge". Nothing could be further from the truth! You are needed. Please give this issue serious thought and get in touch with Veronica Franklin, Pauline Crisp or any of the other trustees.

Of course, some village groups are going from strength to strength, particularly the Gardening Club and our Speedwatch Team, which both gave updates to the meeting. The Link scheme is also a remarkable achievement for villages of our size. There are many other groups that are thriving - though all welcome new members of course.

While on the subject of traffic, the perennial problem faced by our village, it was gratifying to be able to share the positive results from the SIDS installation and to assure residents that ideas that have been shared are still being actively considered and pursued.

I'm proud to say that our attempts to alleviate the problem of traffic speed and volume have been cited as "A shining example of best practice" by a representative of Wiltshire Council, and Malcolm Powell and I both attended the Little Cheverell Annual meeting to give advice and explain how we have gone about things here. We are seeking to work in tandem with other councils in order to maximise our effectiveness and brief discussions took place with a representative of Seend Parish Council who attended our meeting.

There was also a discussion with regard to footpaths and accessibility, particularly along Back Lane. We all rely on residents and landowners to act on our behalf in order to maintain the paths. We also need to work in tandem with Wiltshire Council who have responsibility for footpaths and we cannot carry out maintenance without the permission of the landowner. Indeed, we have limited resources (volunteers, equipment etc.) to do this. So, as I regularly say, please can we do our best to maintain vegetation growth on our property and contact Jules, our clerk, if you need support in doing this. The expected increase in population at the eastern end of the village will make footway links through the village even more important and we have reason to hope that we can work with the developers in due course to improve the situation.

Lastly, this is a good chance for me to once again remind everyone that there is a place available on the Council - if you would like to find out more, please get in touch. Your village needs you!



Worton Parish Council

Annual Parish Meeting - Chairman's report

Following the resignation of Liz Starling, the Parish Council operated without the services of a clerk. The role was taken on by the Chairman, in addition to his role as Chair. It should be noted that this was an unremunerated role which, whilst not ideal, was permissible under the circumstances. Whilst the Chair found the dual role challenging, he was assisted by Cllr Collins who stepped up to look after the minute taking. (Many thanks). Though the surface appearance may have appeared serene and swanlike, the reality was often more like a water challenged ugly duckling! However, we have come through relatively unscathed and, as a handy side effect, a significant financial saving has been made. I am pleased to report that we now have a Parish Clerk in place in the form of Jules Slack, who we are delighted to have on board. We will doubtless benefit from her skills and expertise.

Traffic and related issues

The most important development has been the purchase and subsequent installation of two speed indicator devices (SIDS). The funding came from Worton Parish Council resources supported by grants from Devizes LHFIG (formerly CATG).

The work began in September, with the purchase taking place in November and installation in January. Bob Mitchell and Cllr Powell led the installation process and configuring the software.

Three locations have been used so far with a fourth due shortly. Technically this will count as 8 locations, as turning the device to face the opposite direction counts as a new location. In this way we are following the official guidelines on how SIDS should be deployed.

We are very pleased by how the devices have performed to date. There is evidence that they have significantly slowed traffic down and we have avoided problems experienced by other villages who have installed similar devices. We have been wise to take our time over this and learn from others' mistakes.

A number of other suggestions were made at last year's Parish meeting. We wanted to make this as open as possible and, indeed, it was interesting to hear ideas that were thrown into the hat. The problem is that the dose of reality that applies is usually a significant one, largely

due to financial implications but also practical ones. However, we have presented some of these to the LHFIG group for potential consideration. Changes to village pavements was one idea put forward. This would, perhaps, have the dual benefit of improving pedestrian access whilst, as a side effect, slowing down traffic. There are obvious potential problems with this as there is a risk that such developments could increase the risk of accidents. The cost would also be considerable, certainly beyond the resources of a village of our size and support could only be obtained (for example from Devizes LHFIG) if a proposal was both desirable, practical and affordable. This is highly unlikely in the short and medium term. However, we have decided to undertake a very basic feasibility study of our own (based on common sense rather than particular expertise) before deciding whether there is any viability to this type of plan.

Other ideas have centred on the volume of traffic, as well as the size of the vehicles passing through the village. We have consulted over whether it might be possible to get a weight restriction applied to the road. This involves consultation at County level, where a range of factors would come into play. Again, there are major financial constraints as a feasibility study needs to be undertaken which would be expensive, time consuming and unlikely to get a positive outcome. In simple terms, the problems that would be generated by such a change within the county would be deemed as considerable and the benefits would not be deemed to be sufficient due to the relative sizes of the populations affected. Villages in similar situations to ourselves have been advised to join forces with other settlements situated along the road in question in order to limit costs and strengthen the case, but sadly this does not apply in our case. It would appear that this particular strategy is unlikely to be fruitful in the foreseeable future.

Traffic and related issues have always been prominent amongst the concerns expressed by villagers and will probably continue to be so, given the geography of our site and situation. Your Parish Council will continue to act as best as we can to share and support village concerns. For the moment we will assess how to make best use of our SIDS and their data, alongside our Speedwatch team, who are an important part of a county wide strategy and have been cited as an example of best practice.

We have also contributed to the on-going discussions concerning proposed improvements to the notorious Black Dog road junction.

Planning

Whilst we have dealt with the usual range of planning applications, usually routine and with little to concern, we still have the more significant issue of the anticipated Newland Homes development at Sandleaze. Once outline planning permission was granted (on appeal) we have determined to liaise with Newland and their representatives as constructively as possible.

To facilitate this we organised an informal drop-in session at the Rose and Crown which gave the chance for residents to meet with Tom Sheppard and other representatives of Newland to share concerns and have their questions answered. This took place in a cordial and respectful fashion and we believe that Newland have been prepared to listen constructively.

Tom also came to our October and January Parish Council Meetings and outlined some adjustments that had been made to the plans in response to some of the issues raised.

The latest situation, as I understand it, is that the plans are still awaiting final approval from Wiltshire Planning Officers but, with more adjustments having been made in response to issues raised by residents and others, Newland are confident that work should begin around September. It is important to note that we have been given absolute assurance that priority will be given to Worton residents and their families to take advantage of the affordable housing that will be provided as part of the development.

As a Parish Council, we feel that, as a community, we should now be making the most of the opportunities that the development can provide -both in terms of finance and the influx of population that can bring much needed skills and support to our village and our existing services, particularly the school, church and pub, not to mention village organisations and clubs which are often crying out for volunteers to provide the opportunities which make our village such a vibrant place to live.

Your Parish Council will continue to liaise with the developers to make the construction process as smooth as (continued on next page)

possible and ensure that the changes brought can be as beneficial as possible.

Environment

Cllr Powell has led our team of volunteers on this aspect of the Council's work. We regularly receive reports of issues which cause residents concern, most commonly with regard to accessibility of footpaths. These usually are a matter for good neighbourliness, but we do our best to help where it is needed.

A particularly noteworthy development has been the establishment of King Charles Copse, led by one of our young neighbours Oliver Symes, backed up by Cllrs Goodenough and Goss and aided by other villagers. We have been delighted to hear that we have had a communication from the Palace praising us for the initiative. It was especially pleasing to see such a broad spectrum of villagers working together on this.

Patricia has, indeed, been very busy devoting her considerable talents to another development that has benefited residents in both Worton and Marston. I refer to the improvements to the path (technically a bridle way) that links our 2 villages. Indeed, the path has now been recognised as one of a handful of Queen's Platinum Jubilee walkways and plaques celebrating this honour will be installed at both ends of the path in due course.



In 2023/24 Wiltshire Council is budgeted to spend £62.7m on Children's Services and whilst care numbers are stable – the Council is responsible for more care experienced young people until they are 25 years old. In addition, the complexity of cases has increased, and it can be hard to find the right provision, so sometimes there is a requirement for high-cost placements.

Wiltshire Council is focused on finding local foster carers for local young people so that young people can stay within the local area, as well as making sure siblings find a home where they can stay together. The number of children coming into care continues to rise which means more foster carers are needed – since 2020 70 new foster carers have been recruited but another 30 are needed.

Fostering for Wiltshire Council means all money is spent on frontline services and the child is more likely to be able to stay close to their school, friends and family networks. The council recently increased its fostering rates - they range from £380 to £710 a week per child, depending on people's skills and experience.

Foster carers need to be over 21 years of age, have a spare bedroom,

time to care for a child and a willingness to care and seek to understand young people who have experienced trauma and loss.
