





My mother and I were evacuated from east London to the village in 1939/40 and I am led to believe we stayed with a Mrs Anstey. My only memory is a steep narrow staircase with Mrs Anstey at the top and a toy red fire engine that I played with in the garden. MESSAGE FROM OUR WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR

January 2024

Looking forward to 2024

I hope that you and your family enjoyed a fabulous Christmas and New Year and you may have made some resolutions? You can be assured that I have several things on my Wiltshire Councillor to do list for the year ahead.

Parish Councillors and Residents tell me that speeding and road safety are the biggest issues in our villages. There has been some progress, but there is much more to do. As you may be aware, there are three key interventions: Enforcement, Speed Indicator Devices and Speed Limit Assessments/Reductions and I'm pleased that Parish Councils across the area are working with the Local Highways & Footpaths Improvement Group (LHFIG) on these issues.

Seend's Community Speedwatch Team is now fully trained and is regularly out on the A361, and Worton's Speedwatch Team is also very visible on the High Street – thank you to everyone who volunteers. Other villages with concerns about speeding may wish to take a look at the information on Community Speedwatch (wiltshire-pcc.gov.uk). I'm also pleased that Philip Wilkinson, Police & Crime Commissioner has listened to my feedback regarding Wiltshire Police prioritising speeding enforcement in rural areas. More information is at Road Safety (wiltshire-pcc.gov.uk)

Sadly, accidents are occurring too frequently – especially at Black Dog and Bell Hill/Bollands Hill in Seend, and I will be redoubling my efforts, along with Worton and Seend Parish Councils to deliver improvements. On Black Dog, funding is in place - Wiltshire Council has commissioned a re-design of the junction and is currently in negotiations with the landowners. You can be assured that I will continue to push for these improvements to be finalised as soon as possible. Whistley Road in Potterne and the B3098 through

Erlestoke are also on my list and I will be working with Potterne and Erlestoke Parish Councils to push for solutions.

The Devizes Area Board on Monday 26 February will be a special meeting focusing on "Highways Matters" with presentations from the Cabinet Member for Highways and Senior Officers and I am sure that there will be a lively discussion. Everyone is welcome to attend (6:30pm-8:30pm – I will confirm the location nearer the time).

Finally, as the year draws to a close it remains for me to thank the Parish Councillors for everything they do to help make our villages such welcoming and vibrant communities – it is a pleasure to work with you all.

Dianthus caryophyllus

But most of all let's praise the few Who are seen in their accustomed pew Throughout the year, whate'er the weather, That they may worship God together, These, like a fire of glowing coals, Strike warmth into each other's souls, And though they be but two or three They keep the church for you and me. John Betjeman.

Although many of Betjeman's words do not apply to Christ Church (especially the numbers in the last two lines!), they emphasise that being a member of a church is all about being valued and playing a part in the worshipping community. It is not all about money!

St Paul wrote in his letter to the Ephesians:

And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the the body of Christ..... (4.11-12)

Remember that whatever you do for your church, however small, it is valued, even if it apparently goes unnoticed. As 1993 draws to a close I would like to say 'Thank you' to all who are working for Christ in Worton and Marston.

Good wishes and God's blessings to you all for 1994.


