#### **Worton and Marston Village Show 2023**

We wish you all a very happy 2023 and encourage everyone to get growing, cooking and crafting. A quick reminder that our show is to be held on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> September.

This month can we focus on vegetables. You may think it too early but it is a good time to go through your half used seed packets to check what you have, what's in date and think about what you want to grow during the year. There are many seed catalogues about to look through. Garden centres will be full of displays. I think Wilko's are good too.

Most of the vegetables will be picked fresh for the show so will not be sown until early summer but two main classes to think about now are onions and potatoes.

To grow big onions, many people start by planting seeds now in modules. You can find special varieties of giant onions such as Kelsae. The seeds may need a bit of heat such as a windowsill to get started. Onions can be planted out from about March and will be harvested and stored before the show so you can pick out your best entries.

And keep an eye out for potato days. Pennard plants who are based near Shepton Mallet are one such nursery that holds events in village halls, some fairly local. Rather than buying a big bag, you can buy individual tubers. The nurseries will have many different varieties to choose from, all sorts of sizes and colours, some that you harvest early, others that can stay in the ground until autumn. We have two classes in the show, whites and coloured. You will find varieties that are meant to grow uniform crops so again you can choose potatoes that are of similar size for the show bench. Potatoes are traditionally planted on Good Friday.

More details regarding the schedule next month. We hope that by giving regular updates about the show, we can encourage you to take part. If you want further information, please get in touch.

And so we reach the end of another year and, at last, we have at least one of the Speed Indicator devices up and working (fingers and toes crossed!). Cllr Powell provided us with a demonstration which was most impressive (particularly as we were inside the Village hall and thankfully without traffic!). It will take time to iron out the most effective way to use the SIDS and make best use of the data they provide. An immediate issue was insurance, which we have now solved and the practicality of securing the devices at the various sites. In practice this will mean that we won't be changing locations as often as we had intended.

We are now continuing with our mission to improve the traffic situation in Worton and have decided to prioritise the idea of widening the pavement which will be submitted to Devizes LHFIG in January. We will also be examining the possibility of improving road markings. We are also continuing to press for a review of the weight limit applicable to transport using the road through the village. This topic will be under review at County level next year and we will certainly contribute vigorously to the discussion.

Plans to plant trees sourced from the Woodland trust have moved a step forward with a new site on Sandleaze bank being agreed on. We are very grateful to Oliver Sykes, the local resident who has worked so hard on the project and the Goss family who have been so supportive in facilitating and finding what looks like an excellent result. Public will get access to the trees and we will not lose any of the existing recreation area which, we hope, will get a new lease of life following the completion of the Sandleaze Farm housing development.

The Council agreed the budget for 2022/2023. This will see a small increase in the Precept (in the region of 4%), but will be the first increase in four years. I'm sure residents will appreciate why this is necessary in view of the on-going financial background we all operate in, but we continue to try to use your money wisely and are very conscious of the need for sensible frugality and self-help.

With that in mind, the maintenance work carried out by Cllr Powell and his volunteer team is more important than ever. We are always appreciative of the support given, for example in relation to the re-

placement of the damaged planter at the western end of the village, but more willing hands are always needed. One example is in relation to the two benches at Cuckold's Green and Cedar Close, which are in need of maintenance. When this was last done, they were removed to a resident's workshop. If and when this happens again, it could be an ideal time to possibly re-site one or both of the benches if there was sufficient support from residents. In this regard, it would be interesting to know what residents seek and to find out who currently use and appreciate the benches in their current locations before any potential re-siting happened. Please let myself or any of the other councillors know what you think.

There remains the on-going issue of finding a Parish Clerk. Whilst we have managed as best we can in the interim, this isn't a situation that can go on much longer. We may even need to bring in the Wiltshire equivalent of Jackie Weaver!

Seriously, whilst the role isn't right for everyone (and we appreciate the small number who have shown interest), we are frankly baffled that nobody has responded to the adverts we have placed. I have stressed what a good way this is to support your local community, it's also a rather good way to boost the family coffers in challenging times. The hours are very flexible and just about right to make it worthwhile without being onerous. The only fixed commitment is a meeting once a month, with August totally free. In addition, the pay rates are very fair, suitable support would be provided and possibly training if appropriate. Most of the role is carried out at home and easily fits in with other arrangements. I can assure you of a warm welcome and very friendly and harmonious group to work with. 

#### **Big Improvements for Local NHS Provision in Devizes**

Shortly before Christmas I enjoyed a visit to the new Devizes Integrated Care Centre in Marshall Road, Devizes to see the new facilities and hear about the services which will be offered from the brand new £10m NHS facility. The new Health Centre which will serve patients at the four Devizes area GP practices (St James', Lansdowne, Southbroom and Market Lavington) is the brainchild of Dr Richard Sandford-Hill, Senior Partner at Market Lavington and one he has championed, alongside other local healthcare professionals for many years. Dr Sandford-Hill together with former MP, Claire Perry, lobbied the NHS, and Ministers in Westminster to ensure that Devizes was one of the first towns in the region to secure the funding for a new Integrated Health Centre to complement the work of the local surgeries and as a modern fit-for-purpose base for healthcare services.

The new facility will open fully on 9 January 2023 and will accommodate the services formerly provided at Devizes Community Hospital alongside significantly increased primary care capacity, out of hospital urgent care services, enhanced extended hours services provision, and an expanded range of other health care services. Royal United Hospital Bath (RUH) is providing outpatient services including audiology, care of the elderly, paediatrics, rheumatology and urology. The Avon and Wiltshire Mental Health Partnership (AWP) will provide some of its mental health services from the new health centre. A summary of the services is below:

One of the new enhancements is the provision of same-day, urgent GP appointments - if you need same day or next day care, you should call your usual GP surgery and the receptionist will book a telephone appointment with a clinician at the Devizes Health Centre and if needed, you will be offered an appointment at the health centre.

The new centre is in Marshall Road (SN10 3UF), adjacent to the existing Practice Plus Treatment Centre and is easy to get to by car, bus and cycle.
