Pastoral Letter

The days are getting longer and lighter, spring is here, the sun is shining and it's getting warmer.

As the sun shines through my windows into the dark corners of the house, it prompts me to start thinking about spring cleaning. Looking around the different rooms, I have decided that it's time to put a bit of extra effort into making everything in our house clean and in order.

And so I begin – I know that I am going to turn my house upside down as I clean out the cupboards, take things apart, clean and scrub everywhere. I am going to reach into every dark corner of my house in order to make it presentable, fresh, and new, getting rid of junk and rubbish in the process.

I wonder how many of you still do a thorough spring clean of your homes, or perhaps you may find it all just a bit too much.

We may find it helpful to make a decluttering plan. Mess can affect our mood, but it's not always easy to get rid of things or know where to begin. Why not start by identifying your cluttered hotspots and visualising how you'd like them to look. Break it down into small areas, perhaps even taking "before" photos so you can monitor your progress. Once you get going, put everything into designated bags for recycling, rubbish, selling and donating.

Sometimes we need to do the same thing with our minds, souls and bodies – we need to clean them up and get rid of the junk and rubbish that add clutter and affect our well-being. 

Coming Up in May:





As I write this for May, it is pouring with rain and we have just had wild winds, thunder and lightning and hailstones. So I hope when you read this, that we will have turned the "weather corner" and are enjoying a warmer more gardening sympathetic climate.

Our lovely Village Crab Apple Tree is beginning to open its blossom, so pretty and joyful and is even showing signs of new growth already. The plaque is ordered and should soon be in place. Also, the village troughs have been planted and should provide a lovely display over the next few months.

We had an excellent talk from Sara Willman on growing flowers for cutting. I think one of the interesting points from both Sara and a recent talk at Topping Books in Bath, on the same subject, by Rachel Siegfried, is how in both cases their "Flowers from the Farm" Growing journey has changed from 80/20% Annuals to Perennial plants to 80/20% Perennials and shrubs to Annuals. Something to consider if you love having flowers in your house. In spring, using Blackthorn Blossom, Crab apple, then main crop Apple blossom, along with early flowering shrubs and spring bulbs just gorgeous. Many of these are already in our gardens or hedges and are sustainable and free.

Worton Community Speedwatch – March 2023

(Wiltshire Speedwatch sessions are restricted to 45 minutes)

Sessions: <u>TEN</u>

Total Vehicles Counted: 3,249

Vehicles recorded for exceeding the 30mph speed limit: <u>117</u> of which <u>18</u> were reported to Wiltshire Police for excess speed.

Maximum Speed Recorded: <u>43mph</u> on Friday 24th between 09.30 and 10.15.

Highest Vehicle Count: <u>**532</u>** on Tuesday 21st between 08.00 and 08.45.</u>

(The comparable figures for **March 2022** were: Sessions **8**, Vehicles **2540** and **254** vehicles exceeding 30mph of which **52** were reported for excess speed.)

Indications are that the two Speed Indicator Devices now established in the village are having an effect. Data from the units shows that the vast majority of motorists are observing the speed limit and they are acting as a reminder to people to slow down when inadvertently straying over. We will still have people who totally ignore the speed limit but these are in a minority.

Wiltshire Police are currently running a pilot project with data downloaded from SIDs around the county and we will in due course be adding the results from ours. This will enable them to highlight areas for deploying the speed enforcement teams.

ECO-CORNER

Help needed!

We have been writing this column since December 2020 in an attempt to raise awareness about environmental issues which affect us all and to suggest ways that we can all make a difference. After all that time, we're finding it difficult to come up with fresh ideas or novel ways to present old (but still very relevant) ideas.

We're hoping that one of you reading our articles might be interested in taking on Eco-Corner and developing it in new ways.

We leave you with one final suggestion to help boost tree planting around the world. You can do this by using the ECOSIA search engine: <u>https://www.ecosia.org</u>.

Ecosia makes money each time a user clicks on an advert displayed in the search results. Ecosia put 100% of its profit into climate action through tree planting schemes.

The amount of money Ecosia earns per ad click depends on the value and the competition for the keyword, which means a click on an ad using lucrative keywords will be able to finance multiple trees, whereas other ads may only finance a fraction of it. On average it takes about 45 searches to plant one tree.

Ecosia helps you to see the impact you are having by displaying on its opening page the total number of trees that have been planted by the Ecosia community as well as the number planted as a result of your individual searches.

At the time of typing, this total was 172,020,645 trees but the counter increases every 1.3 seconds! The number of trees planted as a result of Anne's searches is 5! She doesn't often click on adverts but she will do this more often now that she can see it can have a positive effect for the environment.

However, Ecosia says that it doesn't matter if you never click on adverts; by using the search engine you help to increase the number of users and that makes Ecosia more attractive to advertisers, thereby helping to increase their revenue.

Ecosia publishes monthly financial figures on their blog concerning

their income and spending as well as regular updates about their tree planting projects across the world, including the UK.



We do hope the change of night will suit people and that if you have thought of coming, but weren't free on a Tuesday, then this is the time. Jean Lane 722069



Annual Report – May 2023

This month, Annual meetings will take place for Parishes, Parish Councils and Wiltshire Council – they are great opportunities for coming together as a community to reflect on the previous year and discuss the challenges ahead. Some of the highlights from Wiltshire Council, and my own work to support residents in Devizes Rural West are below.

Wiltshire Council's budget for 2023/24, which is underpinned by the council's 10-year Business Plan, is £466m – this includes an additional £69m to cover inflation and increased demand for services and is broken down as follows:

Whole life pathway (mental health, autism spectrum conditions and learning disabilities support services) - $\pounds 96m$, an increase of $\pounds 11m$ Living and aging well (adult care) - $\pounds 83m$, an increase of $\pounds 15m$

Families and children - £63m, an increase of £2m

Environment (which includes waste and recycling services)- $\pounds 48m$, an increase of $\pounds 4m$

Highways and transport - $\pounds 41m$, an increase of $\pounds 3m$ Education and skills - $\pounds 29m$, an increase of $\pounds 6m$

Last November, Wiltshire Council invited the Local Government Association to carry out a Corporate Peer Challenge – the review found that the council's Business Plan provides a clear set of objectives and that focus on improving outcomes for some of the most vulnerable in the community is none more evident than in children's services. It was also noted that the council is excelling in work to address climate change.

In addition to funding of $\pounds 22.9m$ from the Government's Highways Maintenance Fund, $\pounds 3.6m$ was received from the Department for Transport's Pothole Fund which will be used to target pothole hotspots around the county. Anyone who spots a highways issue must report it using the MyWilts app or via the website – and if it doesn't get fixed, please email me at <u>tamara.reay@wiltshire.gov.uk</u>

Wiltshire has welcomed 1,374 guests so far and is one of the top authorities in England for taking in Ukraine nationals - 165 families have now moved into private rented accommodation and every Ukrainian household has a named Case Worker assigned to support the guests to help them integrate into the community. Over the last three years I have led the project for a new rail station to serve Devizes and secured almost \pounds 500,000 from the Department for Transport for business case assessment. The Interim Feasibility Study undertaken over the last few months has now reported. It shows that whilst there isn't a current rail service which could stop at Devizes Gateway without affecting the rest of the rail network, Network Rail has concluded that there may be opportunities for a new train service and station following a broader Wiltshire Wide Rail Review. This is really good news. Devizes is very much at the heart of future rail developments in Wiltshire and along with our MP, and other local organisations such as the Devizes Gateway. The detailed Interim Feasibility Study is online at Findings of Devizes station feasibility study released - Wiltshire Council

It has been a pleasure to support Parish Councils, community groups and residents with a whole host of local issues over the last year including flooding, road safety, footpaths and planning matters. If there is a local issue that you are concerned about, please do get in touch and I will do my very best to help.

Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to all the Parish Councils across Devizes Rural West – they and the many other local organisations help ensure our villages are such fabulous communities and brilliant places to live.



Worton Parish Council

I'd like to start this month's article with an update on our SIDS. Bob Mitchell has been keeping us all in the picture with the information we can download from the devices. They are proving to be both effective and informative.

In the broadest terms, we have evidence of significant improvements in both the numbers exceeding the speed limit and the type of speeds being registered. Thanks to the diligence of our Speedwatchers we can do "before and after" comparisons. There is lots of analysis that can be done but, to make it simple, there's about half as much speeding as there was a year ago... Which is remarkable. In addition, all but a handful of those that do speed are within 5 miles per hour of the limit. As we change the SIDS locations we are reviewing how effective each is and the impact they have on the different directions of movement.

We have been delighted that the locations used so far have been excellent in the utilising of solar energy and, perhaps surprisingly, data is recorded at night and in the opposite direction to that which the SID faces.

One extraordinary statistic that has emerged is that, if current traffic flows are typical, about 1.25 million vehicles pass through our village each year ! (I must confess I have relied on colleagues for the calculation!). Whatever the final figure, this is extraordinary for a "C" road, and may prove useful in any future negotiation with relevant authorities.

I have previously referred to ideas that have been considered to further improve the traffic situation. These tend to be expensive and our budget is limited. A year ago we devoted most of our annual parish meeting to enable ideas to be shared about what we could try to do. That generated a list which the Parish Council considered and prioritised following initial communications with the "experts" at Wiltshire Council. We would only proceed with any projects if they were deemed safe and effective (including cost effectiveness from our perspective as well as other organisations). This all takes time, but as we are seeing with the SIDS, it's worth the wait to get the best outcome. We






