Pastoral Letter

The View from my window

One of the difficulties about writing an article for a magazine which is not going to be published for a little while is the problem of whatever is going to happen next.

As I write, the weather is on the change. It has been gloriously hot, and sitting in the garden in the shade has been the order of the day, and yet I know from the weather forecast that that is about to change with a vengeance.

Similarly, last week things were relatively quiet in the Middle East, but this week literally all hell has broken out, and by the time you read this who knows what will have happened. We clergy are supposed to come up with something clever and wise on such occasions, but for me my main reaction has been of horror and sadness about man's inhumanity to man. Whatever colour or creed we belong to it seems impossible that human beings can be so cruel and barbaric, and yet they can. Over the centuries, time after time war has broken out between different nations and people, and lest we forget, the war in Ukraine is still raging, even though it has gone out of the headlines.

Of course, November is the month for remembering. All our villages will be holding remembrance services, and there will be great solemnity and reminders of the war dead of two world wars. We promised that we will remember them, and we will. Just last week I took a funeral service for a 92 year old man who served in the Korean war, and I remember him coming home, all those years ago, battle scarred and weary. Most of us had family members who served in the last war, and every year when I speak to the children who gather round the war memorials, I try to help them and encourage them by saying that we and they must all try to make the world a better place, so that it won't happen again; and yet fighting goes on, and the atrocities continue.

So what can we do? The most important thing is to pray for peace. It is an imperative. Whoever you pray to, it doesn't matter but we must pray for peace. Somehow we have to understand that in order that this world continues we must learn to live alongside one another. Whether Jew or Hindu or Muslim or Christian or none of these we have to reach out to each other. Ownership of land does not matter. Love matters. My understanding is that all the great faiths agree on that, and I,



Worton Parish Council

Although small in number it is always good to see residents coming to our Parish Council meetings. Often they have important points to make and we are grateful for their contributions.

The October meeting was a good example. It was pointed out that there were several places in the village where an issue was developing due to gravel going out onto the pavement as well as the regular problem of vegetation growing out and needing to be avoided by pedestrians, thus causing a hazard under foot or from passing traffic. The issue is likely to get worse as the daylight hours decrease seasonally. To be fair, the number of sites deemed potentially hazardous is relatively small and we have politely raised the issue where appropriate. However, I would respectfully request residents to keep an eye on this type of issue as they maintain their property. If any resident is experiencing difficulty in ensuring safety as the footpath crosses their property, please let us know (clerk@worton.org.uk) and we may be able to help.

Another point of important information that was raised was in connection with the defibrillators sited at the Rose and Crown. Unlike the new defibrillators installed in Marston and referred to in the last edition of the Bridge, ours DO NOT need any password or code to activate, so please do not hesitate in an emergency!

A very important county-wide consultation is currently coming to its conclusion, in the form of The Local Plan. The final date for contributions to be made, Wednesday 22nd November, is nearing. Put simply, the Plan will set out what future development would look like, for example intentions in terms of housing, infrastructure, open spaces etc. Future planning applications will be assessed in the light of the Plan. 1 recently attended a county-wide event representing the Parish Council. This was mainly an opportunity for local politicians and planners to go through the main points about what factors have influenced the Plan and how it stands nearing the end of the consultation period. To be honest, the main thing of interest to the great majority of attendees were the headline figures of how many houses need to be built to meet the requirements set out in the Plan and where they will be. Worton is classed as a "large village" and thus, unlike neighbouring "small villages" including Marston, has a specific target number of houses to be completed or at least in the pipeline by 2038. Worton's target is 34,

but as there have already been 27 new homes built or in the pipeline, we only have a shortfall of 7 and, as it stands, 15 years for them to come into being. Whilst we and future Parish Councils will need to keep our usual monitoring eye on this, it is likely that the need will be filled over that period by what the planners term as "windfall". This doesn't mean a replication of scenes from "Up!", but rather that these developments have not been part of overall large planning schemes and could not have been anticipated in advance as the circumstances were very local and hard to predict. This kind of development occurs from time to time in Worton and we anticipate it will continue within the time period sufficient to get close to or meet the target as it stands. The plan does need to be aware of the housing development in terms of the implications of an increasing population for service provision. This can work both ways...an increased population boosts the case for improved service provision which can benefit all, but can also create obvious problems if the balance is wrong. We will have discussion of the Plan as the main point on our November agenda which will give residents an opportunity to raise any issues or concerns. Once the Plan has been adopted, scheduled to be next year, it will be in place until 2038 - so consideration of the implications are important for us all. It should be understood that, following final publication, the Plan will still need to go through a period of scrutiny at national level before adoption ..so there's still time for things to change. Full details can be found on wiltshire.gov.uk where there is a link to the planning portal where comments can be made. I won't pretend that the documentation is light reading -necessarily it's a long and sometimes challenging read - unlike Catch 22 there isn't much subtlety or humour, but it's worth sticking with it as it's going to affect all of us over the next decade or so (hopefully!). I would particularly draw attention to table 4.4 in the Chippenham rural area section (which includes us and other local settlements). This makes very interesting reading!

On a related issue, of more immediate concern, the latest situation in relation to the Newland Homes development is that the start of the construction process was delayed whilst the developers awaited the signing off of planning conditions. This has now taken place and the latest information I have is that work should begin on site access this month (November) with actual construction starting in December or January.

We have been carrying out important maintenance on King Charles' Copse and Sandleaze Bank (particular thanks to Cllrs Richard and Patricia, ably supported by Bob Mitchell). We are also getting nearer to seeing our Jubilee plaques in place - ideas in relation to the best way to get them in position have developed...watch this space, or possibly post!

Lastly, we haven't forgotten plans to improve the road safety situation. Ideas have been clarified and rest on an on-site consultation taking place with appropriate representatives from Wiltshire Council. These include a possible speed limit change on the eastern approach, improvement to crossing locations and preparation for the installation of Auto Speedwatch. Potentially this could benefit from liaison with Newland Homes at an appropriate time as well as the previously supportive LH FIG group.

(By the way, we are still 1 Councillor light .. please have a chat if you would like to find out more.)





A Sensible and Pragmatic Approach to Net Zero and Staying Warm this Winter

As Portfolio Holder for Climate Change at Wiltshire Council I followed the Prime Minister's recent announcements very closely. I am pleased that he has not rowed back on the Government's commitments to achieve Net Zero by 2050, but instead that he has reviewed some of the detailed policies and made some adjustments in the light of the continuing pressures on cost of living.

For example, the delay on the ban on oil boilers to 2035, a 9-year extension on the original plans. Households won't need to make the switch until they're replacing their boiler after 2035 and this means that heating oil and lpg households will have time to benefit from reducing costs of heat pump conversions and explore other sustainable options, such as renewable liquid fuel alternatives like Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil (HVO).

Alongside this, the Government has increased the amount that households can claim through the Boiler Upgrade Scheme (BUS) for a new ground source or air source heat pump from £5,000 to £7,500 - more information, including help with finding an installer is at www.gov.uk. This funding is currently available until 2025.

The PM also announced that the ban on new petrol and diesel cars will be delayed to 2035, replacing the previous deadline of 2030 and that second-hand vehicles can still be sold after that date. Important reforms will also be made to new energy and grid infrastructure, so we have capacity in the electricity transmission system as we move away from fossil fuels.

With winter approaching and a distinct drop in temperatures in the last few days many of us will be thinking of ways to stay warm. Warm & Safe Wiltshire is a service provided by Wiltshire Council in partnership with the Centre for Sustainable Energy. It provides in-depth telephone support and home visits to help people save money on their gas and electricity bills, and to get funding for heating and insulation improvements in their homes. The help available includes **free and impartial advice on:**

- Understanding fuel bills and tips on simple ways to save energy and lower your bills.
- Guidance on heating systems and controls. (continued on next page)

- Eligibility for heating and insulation grants and fuel vouchers.
- Issues with damp and condensation.
- Fuel debt advice.
- Switching energy suppliers and fuel tariffs.
- Signing up to the Priority Services Register.
- Discounts and support with water bills.



The speaker for our October meeting (How to keep well) was unable to come but we had a very able and interesting substitute in Mandy Murphy, who lives in Worton and stood in at short notice, for which we were very grateful. Mandy has recently started up as a Massage Therapist alongside her job as a Mental Health Nurse. Interestingly Tuesday had been World Mental Health Day!

We had a short but fascinating run through the history of massage from ancient times (5000BC) through India (3000BC) becoming a religious thing with monks in Japan (1000BC) through to Chinese medicine. The concept arrived in Greece with athletes using a form of massage (700BC) then to wealthy Romans (200-100BC) from when it developed into connections with less savoury activities!

It was revived as a "proper" therapy in the late 20th century and history shows that we instinctively use "touch" as a natural instinct. We rub sore parts of ourselves, we soothe babies and children, we touch those in distress. The many benefits include relaxation, circulation of blood and the Lymphatic system, warming, muscular tension, chronic pain, blood pressure, immune system, flexibility and mobility. WOW!

Mandy gave us a brief rundown of her career(s) in the bank, as Cabin Crew for 10 years, through Counselling, the Samaritans, her 1st degree, the Probation Service and on to her 2nd degree in Mental Health Nursing completed in 2014. She has worked at Erlestoke Prison, and Green Lane Hospital, where she still works now.

She explained that prevention of mental health problems through medication, CBT, complementary therapies and lifestyle change now include things like massage, which has been proven to improve physical and mental well-being. Because massage treatments are often very expensive, and she believes passionately that they are hugely beneficial, Mandy decided to train and provide treatments at a more affordable price. After 4 months (but ongoing) training, she started her small business at home in July. A full medical questionnaire is the first step to ensure there are no health reasons for you not to have massage therapy.
