

November is a time of remembering apart from the November the fifth celebrations. There is Remembrance Day on 11th November and Remembrance Sunday when we remember and honour all those who lost their lives on active service in all conflicts; as well as all those who have served and their families. There will be services in all of the Wellsprings' churches for Remembrance Sunday starting at 10.50am. Details should be elsewhere in this magazine.

Our churches have another time of remembering in November and that is a special service of remembrance and thanksgiving for All Souls' Day. At this Commemoration Service we will remember all those who have died in the past year. This takes place on Sunday, November

6th at St. Mary's Potterne at 3.00pm and St. Peter's Poulshot at 5.00pm. We welcome everyone to this service, but especially any who have been bereaved this past year, and others who feel that this service might help them in their journey following bereavement, no matter how long ago that may be.


No baptisms, weddings or funerals this month.



AMANDA COLEMAN 'MANDY' 25th October 1962 – 11th September 2022



A Thanksgiving service was held for Mandy on October 3rd. Extracts from the address made by Dave Howard are below.

'We have come to give thanks for Mandy's life, but we come also with a great sense of loss. Every one of us will be feeling that sadness today, none more so than Sam, Adam, Charlie and their partners, Mandy's dad, Mike and her brother Tim and his family. There was nothing and nobody more important to Mandy than her family, they were at the centre of her life.

I want to read some of the comments received about Mandy; they speak volumes about her personality. Here is a small selection. 'A beautiful lady; an inspiration to us all; liked and respected by every-

one; she enriched all our lives; beautiful inside and out; a humble lady with a sweet gentle spirit.'

Mandy was born in Poole, and spent her early life in Ferndown. Her brother, Tim, followed her 2 years later, both of them bringing great joy to their parents. Mandy's comment on being presented with a brother was; 'that be nice', sounds very Dorset! She was very independent from an early age, insisting on walking separately from her mother to the local first school from day two. She went to Brownies where Mandy's mum was Brown Owl, and then on to guides. She was a good classical guitarist and also tried the saxophone. She met Neil when she was 15 and he 17. Leaving school with good A levels, Mandy worked for Barclays in Poole. She and Neil married in 1983, living in Verwood for just a year. Work prompted a move to Berkhamsted, Hertfordshire for a couple of years, where Mandy commuted into London and worked 'next door' to St. Paul's.

On moving to Worton in 1986, Mandy settled into village life. Still with Barclays, she worked in Warminster until starting a family. All three boys were born whilst living in Gaisford Chase, before moving to Springfield Cottage, which was the family home for nearly 20 years.

Mandy was involved in several village organisations. She was chair of the school parent teachers' association, on the toddler group and playgroup committees and an active school governor. Much of her social life was found in the friendships of a group of couples, all at a similar stage in their lives. The group formed very deep and long-lasting bonds, sharing meals together, social time and wonderful holidays.

As her children grew, Mandy went back to work. In 2005 she began at Lavington school as a photocopy assistant but, as one of her colleagues at school says, she was quickly promoted to a key role in the office team because of her intelligence, reliability and professionalism. She was known for her support, wisdom and kindness. On leaving the school she quickly found another job in the NHS. She worked there only a matter of months before her illness, but in that time earned the greatest respect and admiration for her care and the quality of her work.

Mandy was naturally a very caring person. She loved to visit people, perhaps to take them a cake she had baked, and to check how they were. She was a member of the parochial church council at Christ Church, Worton, regularly offering her home as a venue for meetings, and a much-valued member of a home group. She was for a while on the Deanery Synod (a sort of CofE local parliament for those who don't know).

She loved to be involved in organising social events in church. Many of you will have enjoyed and appreciated the themed meals in Worton and Potterne village halls to which she contributed so much. This combined two of Mandy's great passions: cooking and helping people enjoy themselves.

Mandy loved simple things in life. Walking was one of her greatest delights, fostered from a young age. The Wiltshire countryside brought her immense joy, birdwatching being a particular pleasure. Music, reading and the sharing of meals with friends, whether as host or guest, were all things she loved.

Mandy was an inspiration to many, her sheer care and compassion an encouragement and example to us all. Up to the last day or so of her life she was asking about others with never a thought for herself.

Mandy's inspiration and strength came from her deep Christian faith. She was confirmed in St. John's, here in Devizes in 1995. Her commitment to her Lord was total and she lived out daily what she believed. On moving to Devizes, she found her spiritual home here in St. James, so appreciating the fellowship and worship.

The Christian hope is that at the end of this life, those who know the Lord will enter into a fuller and greater existence. That is Mandy's experience now. But it does not take away the pain of parting. We shall all miss her dreadfully.


But there are things which even death cannot take away. St. Paul put it well: 'And now these three remain: faith, hope and love, and the greatest of these is love'. Mandy lived by faith, her hope of eternal life is fulfilled, and she now experiences a depth of love unknown on earth, for she is with God himself, and God is perfect love. And the love she shared with us over the years will live on in our hearts, for the greatest of all things is love, and nothing can take that away.'

Worton Parish Council

The last few weeks have been busy to say the least!

First of all, an update on the Newland Homes plans for the Sandleaze site. Jackie and John kindly let us hold an informal drop in session when Tom Sheppard and two colleagues representing Newland Homes shared the latest versions of their plans which had been adjusted following consultations with residents.

Whilst it would be fair to say that not every issue raised could be resolved with complete satisfaction, I felt that the atmosphere was both cordial and constructive. I estimated there were in the region of 30 residents who attended at one time or another and those who I spoke to were mostly satisfied that the issues they had raised had been, and would continue to be, considered seriously and with respect.

Tom also came to our Parish Council meeting where we had a chance to follow up points raised and iron out more detail. Importantly, he has now confirmed that Worton residents and those with a close family link to the village will be given priority in relation to the 7 affordable homes anticipated. We were very pleased to have this confirmed.

Tom also confirmed commitments to improve facilities in the Sandleaze play area and discussed the nature of what kind of open space would be maintained for the use of residents, both existing and newly arrived.

A number of existing concerns have been raised and have been discussed in some detail, chiefly in relation to implications for traffic volumes, flows and safety for residents, particularly pedestrians. These were all considered in a constructive manner and I am confident that, in the course of time, we will see benefits in this area, both directly and indirectly as a result of the development. Of course, the major concern in relation to the location of the agreed access point remains, but Tom has been made well aware of our well-founded concerns and did have some possible ideas to at least ameliorate the situation.

Patricia Goodenough has visited a nearby Newland Homes development at Semington and has reported very optimistically on what she

found there - lots of positives in her report!

One thing that will concern us all is the detail with regard to the actual construction process. There is no specific start date at the moment, but would be likely early in the new year. The build process would probably last about 18 months. There is no disguising the fact that there will be some disruption to village life during this period. Some of the related concerns were discussed in some detail, including noise, dust pollution, congestion linked to delivery of materials etc. Whilst we have been assured that every effort will be made to minimise this, it would be unrealistic to expect these to be completely avoided. However, we have been assured that we will have access to a "help" contact with which on the spot concerns can be raised. Meanwhile, I intend to continue communication with Tom on behalf of the Parish Council, and thus the village.

I also have an update with regard to SIDS installation. As you are probably aware, we encountered a problem with one of the locations we had chosen, but there has now been further on-site assessment and we have now been able to give the go-ahead for the sites to be prepared. When this has happened we will purchase two speed indicator devices which will soon be up and running thanks to our dedicated Speedwatch team.

We have started the ball rolling on a "wish list" of measures to limit the impacts of traffic on our environment. Whilst these mainly had a constructive response from the LHFIG (local highway and footway improvement group), ably presented by a combination of Cllrs Slack and Bonfield, we will need to be patient about timescale and funding. We are relatively hopeful.

You may recall that we have been discussing the possibility of planting some trees with Oliver Symes, an advocate of tree planting who lives locally. An on-site meeting should have taken place by the time of publication.

We have decided to re-advertise the position of clerk which we intend to also include the role of Finance Officer. For the right person this is a rewarding and important post with just enough challenge to make it interesting. Please contact me at clerk@worton.org.uk if you want to know more (I'm currently fielding the communications

myself). A reminder that our next meeting will be on Monday November 7th, starting at 7.30pm in the village hall. Also, please remember to be considerate when celebrating with fireworks - the impacts on our pets, not to mention those of us with a nervous disposition (I include myself!), can be most upsetting.

I feel that I must close this piece by recognising the incomparable contribution made by Ken Harris, who sadly recently passed away. It is not my place to lead the tributes to Ken, but I could not let this opportunity pass without making a small contribution. Ken was Chairman of the Parish Council for many years. In fact, as Worton is the only village I have ever lived in, he very much epitomised the role for me. He has set the standard high, with his effusive enthusiasm and engaging personality. He will always be a hard act to follow, and I hope I have been half as good a Chair as he was. Every community needs people like Ken. They are hard to find but very precious. Worton was lucky to have Ken.



ECO-CORNER

Food Waste

According to the Waste and Resources Action Program (WRAP), food production and consumption are responsible for around 30% of global carbon emissions. Creating more space for agriculture to produce this food has contributed to 60-80% of biodiversity loss through the destruction of natural habitats.

But did you know that a staggering third of all food produced globally goes to waste?

In the UK, 9.52 million tonnes of food are thrown away each year - almost 500 grams per adult each day – the equivalent of everyone in the UK discarding a large box of dried pasta daily.

This waste food emits 25.2 million tonnes of CO2 emissions and 70% comes from households! The impact is not only environmental but also financial. The average household wastes £2 each day - £730 per year!

Here are some ways that you could reduce your food waste:

<u>Plan your meals for the week</u> and use your plan to generate your shopping list. Only buy items on your list so you have only the food you need for the week.

Get your portion sizes sorted: 25% of people questioned by WRAP said that food they throw out mostly comes from cooking or serving too much. If you are unsure how much to cook, Love Food Hate Waste has a portion calculator https://www.lovefoodhatewaste.com/foods-and-recipes/food-portion-calculator-your-guide-perfect-portion-sizes

<u>Freeze anything you can't use</u>: most foods and leftovers can be frozen. Remember to label and date them so you know by when to use them. Incorporate your frozen food into your meal plan. Some helpful tips:

Keep track of your food: monitor perishable foods like meat, fish and salads. These are the ones which go off quickest. Remember "Best

before" refers to quality, so, after that date, it will be safe to eat but might not be at its best. "Use by" refers to safety, so, after this date, you should not eat it, even if it looks and smells ok. It might be helpful to create an eat me first shelf or box in your fridge!

<u>Compost any food waste that you have</u> and, if you don't have the facility, maybe a neighbour will let you add your food waste to their compost.

<u>Check your fridge's temperature</u>: According to WRAP, many people have their fridges set too high, at 7°C; setting at below 5°C will extend the life of milk and other perishable food.



on that have been achieved. The outstanding item, requested by most who answered the survey, is the kitchen. We knew that this would be a long-haul project as it was felt that the current kitchen was not fit for preparing and cooking meals which is what most of you wanted us to address. This means that an extension of some sort is required and we have been lucky enough to work with Nick Mathews on plans for this and on obtaining planning permission. In order to do this work we have had to engage a tree specialist to write a report on preserving the tree in front of the Hall and a Structural Engineer to advise on support for the new build. All these reports are now in hand. We have been given an indicative price of £60k to £70k though this may increase as costs rise and this is why we are now in the throes of fundraising. Currently we have raised almost £30k and are in the process of continuing to submit grant applications as well as fundraising through events. The aim of having a workable kitchen is to be able to hold more community events that include a meal, be it Harvest Suppers or regular lunches. If anyone has any ideas on fundraising or is willing to run an event for us please get in touch with me (01380 726845).
