

#### **Pastoral Letter**

The view from my window:

Since I was a vicar in rural Oxfordshire I have always started my magazine articles with the title "The view from my window" and as I have moved to different places I have continued with this practice. This month is no exception although a very different view or two. I have been in hospital since Christmas, (and thank you to so many people who sent me good wishes and positive thoughts and prayers; they really did make a huge difference;) but the view from my window in Guildford hospital was entirely different from any that had gone before. My ward was on the 5th floor and I could see 180 degrees of the Surrey hills and woods; to my extreme right I could see the cathedral, in the middle the incinerator chimney and to my left the path lab. What a stupid view to be writing about you may be thinking, but I had long enough to meditate upon it; the beauty of God's creation, the ingenuity and brilliance of man's innovations and the progress we have made in medicine. Now we all know one of the glories of living in the UK is the NHS and time and time again we have clapped for it,

praised it and been so thankful as indeed am I; **But**. There are things we need to know. In Guildford we had lots of lovely care assistants, who were efficient and neat and cheerful around the wards but communication was such a problem; elderly people with hearing aids and mask wearing carers are a difficult combination.

On being transferred to the prestigious heart hospital in Tooting, the same problems occurred; we all know that the NHS is under considerable strain at the moment; not many nurses, mainly care assistants, and the nurses there are having to spend most of their time on computers. (I did my own audit). Doctors sweeping in and out, delivering their prognoses and plans, and leaving tients dumbstruck not knowing what was about to happen; no time for the nurses to follow up with explanations. Procedure cancellations were frequent, not least my own, because elective patients had priority presumably because of numbers. I am not blaming the doctors for this. I repeat, we have all heard how much the NHS is under stress,

but in the attempt to keep the ship afloat so to speak, it is the caring nature of the health profession that seems to be suffering mainly because of lack of time.

Why am I saying all this as part of a pastoral letter? The reason is this. We need to be honest. The church is often accused of being too bland or not courageous enough in speaking out and so I am trying to redress that a bit.

I know the National Health service is one of the glories of the UK but we need to stand up to the plate. Throwing money at it without a proper audit seems to be very unwise. In my view The NHS should not be about saving lives but healing people. (You may disagree). All patients are people; people with hearts and minds and loved ones and relatives. The most important thing for us as human beings is that we are in relationship; relationship with living things; plants, animals and most particularly people. Communion and community are two words which are so close and so is communication. We need to take the time to communicate, particularly with the vulnerable. We are not machines. We are living breathing sentient beings, who come from Almighty God our creator and whence one day we will all return.

In my mind's eye I can picture Jesus the healer. Jesus who cared and suffered so much for human beings; Jesus who immediately knew that strength had gone out of him when someone touched him in faith; Jesus who spoke so clearly when he healed the sick. Jesus, who had time for each and every individual; Jesus the compassionate.

My prayer today is that we give thanks for all those people who are engaged in healing the sick whether in hospitals or GP practices, in social care or in our own communities, and that we pray for all carers whether professional or amateur. I pray that all of us take the time to listen, to be compassionate and to reach out to each other. It really matters.



#### **ECO-CORNER**

#### 'The Great Fashion Fast'

In July last year, we wrote to ask whether you knew that Fashion is one of the world's largest industries, with annual revenues totalling over £1 trillion, but it is also one of the world's biggest polluters? It produces 10% of global carbon emissions, more than all international flights and maritime shipping combined.

Now, the Duke of Cambridge is also targeting industries including Fast Fashion and called for more solutions as he promotes his Earthshot Prize in Dubai. "This year we want to focus on tipping points that can accelerate change," he said, citing sectors like Fashion.

The Fashion industry plays a big part in climate change – making severe weather "shocks" such as droughts, floods and storms more common. And it's people living in poverty who are suffering the after -effects.

Fast Fashion is harming creation and forcing people further into poverty. But the charity Tearfund, says it has just the challenge to help reverse that.

Often when looking to raise money for an important cause, such as helping vulnerable communities around the world adapt to the climate crisis and lift themselves out of poverty, sponsored runs, walks, cycling challenges are chosen. Tearfund, on the other hand, has come up with another idea and is urging you to sign up during March to *The Great Fashion Fast*.

The idea is that, by becoming more knowledgeable about how much we need versus how much we use, and by undertaking to live more sustainably together, the Fast Fashion throwaway culture that is triggering so much harm will eventually come to an end.

So how does *The Great Fashion Fast* work? You are encouraged to choose ten items of clothes (underwear, uniforms, keep fit attire and shoes not counted) and find people to sponsor you to wear only those ten items for all of March.

#### **Worton Parish Council**

Our February meeting seemed like a small step on the road back to normality with a reassuring "business as usual" feel. As is often the case, traffic issues held a prominent place. Progress towards the purchase and installation of speed indicator devices is taking place with all of the details being finalised. We have been allocated funding to support installation costs by the Devizes CATG group and the final steps needed are the decisions on the precise locations that will be used for the devices along with the necessary consultation involved with local residents as well as the Wiltshire engineers. Whilst we have no specific date as yet, we are very hopeful that we will see our SIDS up and running in the Spring.

Recently published data shows, unsurprisingly, that Worton has one of the largest volumes of traffic of any unclassified road in the county. Of course this is a matter of geography, with our village lying on a very convenient through route which is appreciated by just about everybody apart from the residents of Worton! We continuously raise the issue at County level and rack our brains as to what is practically possible against the local, regional and financial realities. For example, if Worton were considered to be in proven need for a bypass, where would it go, how would the undoubtedly high costs be met and what would the negative environmental costs be for the surrounding towns and rural areas? There is no obvious solution for a chronic problem due to our site and situation.

We are very interested in novel potential solutions and ideas and always welcome them for consideration. It has been interesting to note that the issue raises strong feelings on social media, and your Parish Council is actively considering how to arrange an opportunity for those concerned and interested to get constructively involved. It's worth a reminder that we still have room for another councillor which would be the ideal way to play a positive role in respect of this and other issues.

The traffic data referred to above illustrated again just how effective our Speedwatch team is, both in the sheer amount of time devoted to the cause and the, perhaps surprisingly, relatively low percentage of speeders recorded. They are clearly an effective deterrent! However, they need support, not just in terms of volunteers, but also from the

Police. Philip Wilkinson, the new Police and Crime Commissioner, has, as they say, made all the right noises in terms of traffic speed in villages like ours, and has been made well aware of our concerns by communication from both your Parish Council and Tamara Reay, our County Councillor. In particular, he indicated that he is supportive of auto speedwatch technology - which we have been reluctant to purchase without the unambiguous support of Wiltshire police. We will wait and see before making any commitment. The PCC's plans are likely to include a recognition of the concerns we have about the sometimes seemingly ambivalent attitude taken towards crime in rural areas, particularly with recent incidents in our village in mind. We will keep voicing our concerns as appropriate.

We have been following up residents' concerns about the lack of Play equipment at Whatley's Leaze. I think it's time for a bit of a reality check here. Having listened to local residents we have looked at just what is available and what the costs would be. The cost of just one installation, such as a small "pirate ship", would be more than the total annual income the Parish Council gets from the precept - and even then we would have to carry out the installation ourselves, which would otherwise add a further couple of thousand to the costs. It is important to realise that the original play equipment was provided as part of the infrastructure needed to support the establishment of the Sand Leaze development and that the complex health and safety issues now in place have made the provision of affordable equipment a difficult challenge.

Cllr Powell has been pleased with the responses he has had so far with regard to the Village Maintenance group and has plans for a seasonal "Spring Clean" advertised elsewhere in this issue. Thanks for your support.

As we go to press there is also encouraging news with regard to Footpath WORT11/MARS9 as the funding seems likely to be in place for the work to improve the section of the path where it crosses the brook. We are very grateful to the other councils involved and, particularly, the generosity of local residents.

Whilst on the topic of footpaths, can we again request that dog owners continue to not only "scoop the poop" but also to remove

the results and place in a bin or take it away? There has been a recent spate of leaving the used bags as a kind of unsightly decoration. We have agreed to provide new advisory signs about removing dog waste. Sadly many of those that were already there have been vandalised or removed, which is very frustrating for us all.

Lastly, with so many new residents since that last time we could have a "normal" village meeting or Newcomers party, may I take this opportunity to encourage participation in the many brilliant village social groups that are still up and running. Don't be shy! You are welcome and needed.

#### **Benches**


Re-varnish benches at Cedar Close and corner of Cuckolds Green

#### **Worton and Marston Gardening Club**

This new year has had a reasonable start for our gardens. It has probably been cold enough to kill off some of the pests and diseases that our warmer winters have allowed to survive, without the really damaging cold spells that we have endured during periods of extreme weather. I have also noticed that the snowdrops seem to be a bit later coming into flower this year than they have been for the previous two or three years. This time last year our daffodils were well into bloom in our back garden. This year they are just about to start. Mostly, however, I notice the lack of rain. This has been brought to my attention by several farmers that I have been delivering to over the last month, both on the Cotswolds and in Wales, the usual comment being, "can't believe how dry it has been. We shall pay for this later". Time will tell whether this comes true!

In our garden, I have finished putting manure, compost and blood, meat and bone meal around our roses and shrubs that I feel will benefit from this treatment. The lawn has been slightly attacked by the moles, but nothing compared to my neighbours' lawns, and I am waiting a bit longer before giving it the Spring nourishment and treatment it requires. As I reported in an earlier edition, I haven't deep dug our vegetable garden this year. The ground is clear of weeds, has been manured and looks ready to plant. As we have so far had an exceptionally dry season keeping our greensand soil sealed may turn out to be the right thing to do. This time next year I will have the answer. Fortunately I have my cars and workshop to retreat into when I get bored, and there is nothing to do in the garden. Best wishes to all. Dave

I am a ceramic historian and recently bought an invoice that mentions Worton Bridge. The document is an invoice, elegantly written in copperplate handwriting by a scribe acting for a builder.

It is headed 'Work done on the Estate of Tho Kinsey Esqr/ By Edwd Hedges/ Began Work for Repairs Lady Day 1764'.

There are 15 entries for various sums (Total £2 6s 2d.) These mostly relate to repairs to farm buildings, roofing, floors, rafters etc. but the following locations are mentioned specifically 'At Mouse House Barn', 'At Worton Bridge Cowhouse', 'At Seven Acres' and 'For Repairs at Broad Green Cowhouse' and 'For driving out White Earth by the Pound'.

Thomas Kinsey paid the invoice on April 5<sup>th</sup> 1766.

Do you or anyone at Worton have any knowledge of this local landowner in the mid-18th century and do the locations still exist?

Any feedback would be most welcome.

## EDINGTON ARTS OPENS ITS 2022 SEASON WITH - SOMETHING COMPETELY DIFFERENT!

It's not very often you find a Choral Workshop which doesn't need you to be able to sight read or read music, or even one where it doesn't matter which voice part you sing. But Edington Arts has come up with one – a half day Plainchant Workshop in the Priory Church on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March, starting at 2.30pm and finishing with Compline at 6.30pm.

The workshop will be led by Peter Stevens, the Assistant Master of Music at Westminster Cathedral - though in Wiltshire he may be better known as the Director of the Edington Festival Schola, the specialist plainsong choir. He is one of the most knowledgeable and enthusiastic practitioners of what is the forerunner of modern musical notation, sung at services from the Middle Ages, and which would have been perfectly familiar to the monks in the Priory Church in the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> Century.

Peter will give a bit of background to plainchant, how it works, and will teach us the chants for Compline, which we will sing in the church at 6.30pm. As the Compline chants are relatively straightforward, he may also bring some which are more developed for us to get our teeth into. We are hoping that some of the regular Festival Schola members will be able to join us to provide a bit of practical support and encouragement – this may after all be an entirely new experience for many of us.

The cost for the half day is only £10, including music and midafternoon refreshments; £5 for students in full time education or training. There will be tea and cake at 5.30pm, for a small donation, to which friends and family are warmly welcomed, before Compline at 6.30pm.



#### EDINGTON ARTS WELCOMES ITS FIRST TRIO

Saturday April 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7.30pm marks the first time a Trio has played for Edington Arts in the Priory Church, and it's no ordinary trio. Metamorphoses is an unusual ensemble of piano, viola and clarinet. #### Wiltshire Council agrees its budget and business plan

At a marathon meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> February Wiltshire Council debated and agreed the 2022/23 budget and 10-year Business Plan. Over the next year the council will spend over £417m - with over 56% (£235m) on support and care for adults and children

£92m will be spent on the vital day-to-day services such as waste management, road maintenance, leisure and library services, as well as the council's carbon management and climate change work - which recently saw the council ranked as the fifth best unitary authority in the UK for its response to the global challenge. The council will also continue its commitment to invest £1m a year to support high streets across the county to become vibrant places for shopping and leisure.

One of the most debated parts of the budget was the proposed increases to car parking fees which help to fund rural public transport. Councillors made arguments about the impact on our high streets (but see the £1m per annum investment above). Our local charges are already competitive compared with neighbouring counties and it should also be noted that fees are not planned to increase for four years so that the costs of implementing the increase (car park signage and reprogramming machines) can be offset over this period.

The council's capital programme, which is spent on projects to improve and maintain the county's infrastructure is confirmed to be £307m in 2022/23. This will be spent on many different projects including leisure services, council house building, schools maintenance, footpath and highway improvements.

The 10-year Business Plan ensures that the budget has a clear long-term focus. It outlines the council's key themes - prevention and early intervention; improving social mobility and tackling inequalities; understanding communities; and

working together. It includes metrics ensuring the council can measure its performance and keep on track.

This strategic focus is essential due to the current financial challenges facing public services, which includes the ongoing pandemic, rising inflation, and increased demand for support. More than half of the council's budget comes from council tax, and this will increase by 1.99%, with an additional 1% directly supporting adult social care. For a Band D property, that's an increase of 91p per week. Alongside this, the council has put plans in place to make savings of around £25m in 2022/23 while limiting the impact of vital services as much as possible.
