



A Message from Richard Gamble

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

As I write this I recall that, a year ago at this time, I wrote about Brexit (or the absence of Brexit, as it was then). Remember that?

Subsequently, we have had a change of Prime Minister and a general election. Remember those things?

Since then, Brexit has been done (to some degree), and I subsequently put climate change and the risk of flooding at the top of my list of concerns for all of us and for Wiltshire Council. Really! How the world turns, and in so short a time!

Climate change is not now top of my list of concerns. Just before I started writing this, I had been shopping in Devizes. My wife had asked me to buy toilet paper, as well as other things, but the toilet paper shelves were bare. There had been panic shopping in Devizes! Can you imagine the consequences if the Gamble household runs out? Better not think about it but we're now beginning to be slightly apprehensive!

And what about the financial markets? The last time the stock market collapsed by over 30% was in 1987, over 30 years ago and just after the Great Storm. At the time, I blamed the weather but subsequent analysis referred to "De-linked markets and index arbitrage", "Portfolio insurance hedges", "Noise trading" and "Margin calls and liquidity". No, I don't know what those are either.

But what is happening now? Are my savings safe? My pension? Am I at risk of serious infection (actually, at my age, I think I may be). So, should I attend the Area Board – or anything? Should I go to County Hall? To church? To the shops?

You may have the same concerns. But I sincerely hope that, in due course, we will all look back and smile. Most of us survived Black Monday 30 years ago without too much pain. Some of us are old enough to have survived Asian flu in 1957. Our ancestors (by definition) survived Spanish Flu in 1918. Life goes on!

I think the main messages are: 1. Take reasonable precautions, 2. Follow advice and 3. Don't panic.

April is here! Spring is in the air.

I do love this time of year, it is a time when we remind ourselves of, and then celebrate, the new life that can be had in our relationship with Jesus using the wonderful English signs of Spring. We are fortunate to live in such beautiful rural villages surrounded by lambs, primroses and daffodils, baby rabbits and so on, but of course there is new life to be had in each of us and in our communities as well.


This year during Lent our church communities have taken a moment to turn away from the many distractions of daily life to spend time with God reflecting on God's plea for us to "Care for Creation". It has provided us with the opportunity to rebuild our relationship with our planet, and in turn with the God who is Lord of everything. We have spent time together learning and praying about the remarkable world we have been given and hopefully will have built habits that last beyond the season to protect and honour the earth.

At the time of writing, one of the biggest current news topics is the spread of the COVID-19 virus, a highly infectious form of coronavirus. The threat posed by the virus in this country has been deemed 'moderate', and there is good advice available on how we can help to protect ourselves and our communities. The Church of England has issued its own quidance to parishes on how to respond, and we are responding accordingly.

As I've followed the development of this story, I've been struck by how events like this make the world seem very small. Events which start off half a world away and seem very remote, can in a very short space of time draw close to home.

The 17th century poet and priest John Donne famously wrote, 'No man is an island.' Sometimes we forget just how connected we are. We need to be sensible and take the public health advice offered (and with due regard to our own vulnerabilities), with-



This is an accurate recognition of the tremendous work put in by the small group of trustees and their supporters. Our new MP, Danny Kruger, will be in attendance and it will be great to have the chance to get to know him better in what will not be a party political context. By a remarkable bit of serendipity, we managed to plan an information session with regard to Community Led Housing for the same time and place, so there's no excuse for missing either event! Lastly, you will be aware of the on-going concerns about the dangerous Black Dog road junction and may have seen reports in the local media about the issue. In short, it has been recognised that evidence shows this junction to be a much greater problem at a county level than previous data had suggested. This makes the issue more than a local one and changes the auspices under which actions can be determined. Hopefully this will bring about a better funded and more viable solution than could be achieved at a local level, though one trusts it won't simply become another factor leading to delay.

Let's hope the world looks a bit healthier next month!






