Looking in my diary for an idea for this month's Ramblings I see that it is Thanksgiving Day in Canada (9th) and I am leading an assembly at Keevil School (11th) on the theme of "Thankfulness". Yes! I suppose that gratitude is a way for me to appreciate what I have instead of always reaching for something new in the hopes it will make me happier or thinking I can't feel satisfied until every physical and material need is met. Gratitude helps me refocus on what I have instead of what I lack.

Important information regarding the use of Community Defibrillators

Following some confusion over how to access the defibrillator at The Chapel in Marston I felt a reminder of how the system operates would be useful. This applies to all Community Defibrillators which are kept in a public place in a locked cabinet. These are accessed by a code which is held by the Ambulance Service. When a 999 call is made the service will provide the location of the nearest Defib machine and the access code. Ask for it if necessary.

If you think someone is suffering a heart attack first call 999. The operator will guide you through CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and advise you of the location of the nearest defibrillator and importantly give you the access code. They will ask you to continue with CPR and to get someone else to locate the defibrillator. Never leave the casualty on their own. The machine will give you clear audio instructions. You cannot hurt the patient as it will only work if they are in cardiac arrest. You do not need training.

Hopefully you will never need a Defibrillator but keep this information somewhere just in case.

It follows the guidelines issued by South West Ambulance Service.

Our machine in Marston is checked once a week by a group of volunteers as required by the service.

The Emergency Services use What3words.com to locate you wherever possible. Download the app. It's a life saver!

£10m extra to improve our roads

Residents and Parish Councils across Devizes Rural West tell me regularly that the maintenance of our roads is one of the top priorities. I'm really pleased therefore, that prudent financial management of Wiltshire Council's budget has meant that an extra £10m has been secured for preventative highways work.

The £10m of extra funding, which is on top of the £14m the Council will spend this financial year on highways maintenance, is being funded through the Council's capital funding programme. The additional money will be spent on preventative maintenance and a road resurfacing programme including small, local repairs to the highways; verge repairs on rural roads and materials support to volunteers working on public rights of way. Work on potholes will continue in parallel, with £2m existing funds and the government's recent £3.6m additional grant.

The preventative investment will reduce the number of potholes forming on the road network, mitigate the risk of further deterioration; improve road safety across the county for all road users; improve customer satisfaction and reduce the number of highway defect reports to the Council, which will save officer time by reducing the number of adhoc inspections required and expensive reactive works.

This additional funding allocation has been made following the first formal update of the 2023/24 financial year. At the end of the first quarter there is a small forecast overspend of around £0.3m which equates to less than 0.1% of the budget. More than £26m of savings were identified to be made during 2023/24 and, at the end of the first quarter, more than £6.2m has already been achieved (around 24%) with a further £15.7m on track to be delivered (around 60%).

This is really good news for Wiltshire residents as this careful financial management ensures that the Council can deliver core services such as children's and adults' social care, as well as the other services which we all rely on, and focus on the local issues such as roads which really matter. By contrast, the list of local authorities up and down the country which are at risk of bankruptcy, is growing.

The programme of additional highways work will begin with identifying the roads due to be resurfaced and give Area Boards the opportuni-

ty to comment before the work programme begins in earnest from April 2024 until the end of 2025. Meanwhile please do continue to use My Wilts to report concerns.

Our September meeting was a chocoholics delight!! We were happy to welcome several visitors for the evening. Holly Garner from HOLLY-**CHOCS** in Poulshot gave us a delightful and jolly talk on how she had become involved in chocolate production, via a degree in Chemical Engineering to working for Cadburys (responsible for the technology behind the bubbles in the Wispa bar!) and then on to starting her own business in 2019. She has won many prestigious awards since, does many talks around and about and has just opened a café on her premises!

Holly showed us the fruit as it comes off the tree, the inside fleshy part and the beans nestled inside, from which chocolate comes. The beans are dried on the ground (on banana leaves) before being ground into powder, which is used then to produce actual chocolate. We tasted a dried bean, then small pieces of chocolate of varying degrees of cocoa solids going from 85% down to 40%. The more cocoa content the less sugar used.

Holly is very careful to source her chocolate from growers who receive a fair price! We saw pictures of the many varieties of chocolates she makes by hand, and were able to purchase some of her products at a special discount for the evening. Altogether a delightful and delicious evening.

On OCTOBER 11th we have a visiting speaker, Wendy Hubbard who is a qualified Physiotherapist and will instruct us in an easy and fun way, in "HOW TO KEEP WELL". We should leave the evening sitting and standing better at the very least!

A fairly brief contribution from me this month, which may come as something of a relief to many of you!

I was unable to attend the September Parish Council meeting. I would like to say that I was carrying out a field investigation into local government in British Columbia and Alaska. Unfortunately the truth is that I was fulfilling a long held ambition of both Sarah and myself by way of our first real holiday since the Pandemic. Incidentally, I was pleasantly surprised by the sheer lack of political divide on the Cruise ship that was our temporary home and just how well the fairly diverse merry band of explorers got on with each other.

Anyway, I am very grateful to Richard and co who covered so well for me in my absence.

We are looking actively at carrying out improvements in terms of traffic and road safety. Ideas that have been raised and discussed earlier are progressing. These include a possible new crossing on the High Street and a speed reduction on the eastern approach to the village. We are also hoping to get support towards the improvement of the surface of the crossing at Cedar Close and the painting of new roundels by the village gates at the western end. We intend to consult with Newland Homes with regard to road safety and improvement strategies linked to their intended access. Finally, we intend to gain support for a future installation of Auto Speedwatch.

Strategies to maintain and support the new King's copse plantation were discussed as were on-going concerns about stream overflow problems at Mill House / Croft Farm.

Lastly, it is likely that there may be some availability of an allotment in the near future. We have already had an expression of interest in this regard, but please contact Jules on clerk@worton.org.uk if you would like to find out more.

WORTON & MARSTON W.I.

The first meeting after the summer break of Worton & Marston W.I. was held on 14 September in the Village Hall.

The President Mrs Babs Stockwell welcomed members and visitors to the Open Meeting to hear Mr Derek Johns, this year's BBC MasterChef, give an illustrated talk on The Art World in which he has worked for the last 30 years. For 20 years he was employed by Sothebys before starting his own business specialising in art up to the 18th Century.

Difficulties were, however, experienced with not one but two projectors and Mr Johns decided to abandon his planned talk. Instead he gave an insight into the activities behind the scenes of the Television series MasterChef. Last year there were 6,000 entries and before being accepted 40 or 50 questions had to be answered. The competition was very fierce.
