

Pastoral Letter

The short Bible study course I am currently following, focusing on the letter of James (New Testament), calls it "a practical how-to book on Christian living. Forthright and pulling no punches ..." I've certainly found that to be the case. Although aimed at Christians, and Christian "enquirers", James (thought to be the brother of Jesus) gives sound advice for all who strive to live in harmony in the world and with each other.

One of the issues James writes about (among many) is our mis-use of words. We underestimate the lasting effect those we use in anger, abusive situations or through just plain thoughtlessness can have on the person to whom they are directed. We see and hear examples of this in our daily lives, don't we? - on television, the radio, Facebook and other social media, as well as, sometimes, on our streets or in our shops. The sad thing is that, like the bucket with a hole in the bottom, the "bad" words leak out and - too late! - we have no way of retrieving them. The damage is done. An apology might go some small way in making things better but the memory and hurt always remain. James reminds us that we can "control and tame wild animals, steer

huge ships with small rudders and control horses with small bits, yet no human can tame the tongue." "... our words either bless or curse, delight or destroy, heal or hurt, comfort or cut."

Ash Wednesday, was on 26th February. It marked the first day of Lent, the 40 days that precede Holy Week and Easter - 40 days in which to reflect on our shortcomings – to resolve to use our words wisely in order to affirm others and value them, regardless of our mood or provocation – to say the right thing at the right time - and to prepare ourselves for the Good News of Easter.

A lot of people look upon Lent as a time of giving things up - chocolates or cigarettes are favourites - but wouldn't it be better to give our time or our money (perhaps from saving the cost of those chocolates and cigarettes!) to a charity, or someone in need? There are so many different ways in which we can bless the lives of those around us and bring God's kingdom just a little closer here on earth. May you come to know Him and His love over the next few days and weeks. And remember: be a blessing, as vou are blessed.

Marston Parish Council

A meeting of Marston Parish Council was held on the 6th February, it was attended by 14 parishioners and Councillor Richard Gamble (Wiltshire Council).

A letter from Mr. Davison was discussed in relation to the management of the common land. The pond and the grip have been cleared and landowners have cleared the ditches adjacent to the common land. Reseeding with grass and wild flower mix will take place in early spring and the dew ponds will be cleared when the weather allows. Conservation Contractors will be felling dead and unsafe trees along the track from Long Street to the Parish boundary stone in the Spring, when the weather improves. Mr. Walker requested that any replanting would undertake to use indigenous tree stock. The Parish Council supported his request.

Councillor Richard Gamble agreed to investigate the flooding, ditches and broken boundary fence at Norney Bridge and we have sent him a letter to explain the issues.

The Parish Council would like to make a polite request to dog walkers to clear up after their animals when on common land and take plastic bags home rather than leave them hung on bushes or on the verges, as dog faeces on the Green above and below the pond is becoming an issue.

An application was made by Worton and Marston School to the Solar Community Fund to help them renew their school website. The application has now been taken to the next stage and will be agreed upon at the next meeting.

Two planning requests were dealt with:

Application20/00451/TCA Willow tree re-pollard at Pound Cottage Plough Lane, SN10 5SR for Mr. M. Cherrington. The Parish Council supported the application.

Application 19/12138PNCOU Notification for prior approval under Q class change of use for agricultural barn to form one dwelling and for associated operational development at: Barn New Farm, Goose Street, Marston. SN10 5SP for C.M. Howard and Sons. As this was a Q class application the Parish Council had no objections to make under the set parameters of the application.

Grazing on the common land will be taking place, by a registered grazier of the common land, in mid-summer on the section adjacent to the New Farm fields; more information will be given at the next meeting.

The next meeting will take place on Tuesday 24th March 2020 in Marston Chapel at 7.30pm.

Worton Parish Council

As we settle into a new decade, your councillors have been looking forward in a positive frame of mind!

An important issue will certainly be housing provision. Whilst there has been considerable discussion, false starts, concerns and not a little effort on the part of a range of interested parties in the village there has, in fact, been little or no change. You will be aware that there has been general agreement about the size of any new development that might occur (indicated by the results of surveys that were undertaken by the Parish Council and by the Neighbourhood Planning group) but no decisions were made. A major factor has been the changing local, regional and national situations and a concerning potential rise in costs that we would have to meet. Thus, we have pretty much stood still.

In some ways this has been beneficial, as it has allowed both a taking of stock and a clarity on what might and might not work. Which brings me to the meeting that we are organising to take place on Friday 3rd April, at 7pm in the Village Hall. There will be representatives there from groups with advice and experience on what is referred to as "Community Led Housing". This is a relatively recent concept that has found favour both nationally and locally, and could well offer a very positive opportunity for us. Cllr Malcolm Powell has been working hard on this, and you should find more information in the pages of this edition of the Bridge. In the past, meetings on this topic have been very well attended, so hopefully the village hall will be full on April 3rd too!


You may recall that I mentioned in the last edition of the Bridge that we have been asked to express our interest, if any, in a number of small plots of land scattered around the village. I referred to the area of grass near the entrance to Mill Head which was, at the present time, the most attractive of the plots considered. One of the reasons I mentioned this was to gauge opinion on the topic, and I did mention the problem of current limited car parking for the village hall and church. This is an obvious ongoing issue which has implications for two of the most important facilities that we have in the village and thus for all of us. However, I hope I made it clear that absolutely no decisions had been made at this stage and that full consultation would occur. It was thus pleasing to receive a small, though useful,





A Message from Richard Gamble

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

By the time you read this, unless something very surprising has happened, Wiltshire Council will have approved its budget for the coming year 2020-2021.

The budget is no small thing but the underlying principle is the same as your own financial management. If you spend only what you can afford, the result is happiness!

Wiltshire Council's recurring income comes from several sources:

- 1. Council Tax. After an increase of 1.9%, this should bring in £260,830,000 next year
- 2. Social Care Levy. After an increase of 2%, this should bring in £23,893,000
- 3. Business Rates Retention. This should bring in £56,600,000
- 4. Other. £2,700,000

The total is £344,023,000.

It is worth mentioning that the business rates collected in Wiltshire will total over £160 million but it all gets transferred to the government who will give us back only £56.6 million - about 35%. The rest is used to support other areas of the country.

From this income, it is proposed that the money will be spent on:

- 1. Adult Care & Public Health Services approx. £153 million
- 2. Children & Education Services approx. £80 million
- 3. Growth, Investment & Place Services approx. £99 million The rest goes on administration, ICT, legal etc.

Children & Education Services does not include schools (which will receive £374.5 million from government through the Dedicated Schools Grant). The Council's money is mostly to support the most needy and vulnerable. Overall, with the Adult Care programmes, about 67% of the Council's income is spent upon the relatively few people, young and not-so-young, who have very considerable problems.

One of the challenges that the Council faces is that the number of those with high needs, young and old, is growing faster than the income. Therefore, much effort is going into delivering more for less across the board. In all, we need to find about £34 million by

Community Led Housing Event

Friday 3rd April - from 7pm Village Hall

Worton Parish Council is hosting this event to provide more details about Community Led Housing, how it could affect the village and to discover the views of the community. Please come along and let us know what you think.

The event will be supported by Homes of Our Own, an advice hub partnered by Wiltshire Council, Community First and Wiltshire Community Land Trust. We are also delighted to welcome Seend Community Land and Asset Trust who are in the process of submitting their planning application for a development of community houses and will be sharing their experiences with us.

Community Land Trusts

A Community Land Trust is a legal entity set up by communities to provide and protect assets of community value such as community housing. It is a not-for-profit organisation that is run and made up of members of the community, membership is open to all residents from age 16 at a cost of £1.00 for life. These members oversee the development of affordable houses to rent or buy (typically working with a local housing association). They are a popular and effective way of delivering local housing schemes that are run for the benefit of the community. When the homes are complete the Community Land Trust remains a steward.

A Community Land Trust can reserve the homes for local needs by placing legal conditions on the sale or rent of any homes built as part of the scheme. It is not just current residents that benefit from lower housing costs, an asset lock means the affordability is legally protected so that future residents will also benefit. Any surplus funds that a Community Land Trust earns or raises must go back into the pot and used for community benefit.

Proposed Site

The site currently under consideration for Community Led Housing is the disused allotment land at the junction of High Street and Mill Road previously proposed for housing development by Worton and Marston United Charities. Should the Community Led Housing scheme require more space for design or access safety reasons
